1. IQAC Activity Report Presented By Director, IQAC

The Director, IQAC presented a report detailing the activities and progress the institute has made since July 2012 i.e. during the NAAC Cycle I period. The report reflected the continued growth of the college and strength in its operations and programs. The following topics were covered in the presentation

The members welcomed the report and appreciated the effort of the institute for continuous improvement and making good academic progress for the said period. A copy of the presentation is provided in **annexure I**

While deliberating the issue, the following facts were brought to the notice of the Committee:

- a. The Audit team headed by Dr.Ravishankar Deekshit, Professor of EE & Dean, Student Affairs and Dr.P.Meena, Faculty of EE have completed the Energy audit of the campus and submitted a report on 09.05.2017. The report on the Green Audit is expected to be received on 13.05.2017.
- b. Dr.S.Manoharan briefed the members regarding various steps initiated towards conduct of SWOC analysis. He informed the members that Dr.Pawan Soni, Doctoral Fellow from IIM, Bengaluru has been identified as the external member of the SWOC Team. The team is currently working on the format to collect data from the departments for making analysis. The process is expected to be completed by the end of this month. The Principal noted his consent for the nomination of Dr.Pawan Soni and hoped that the assessment is organised and completed within time limit.

- b. The Principal informed the members that at the behest of our Chairman a formal body to connect alumni and the Institute was established. Today more than 16000 alumni have registered in the network and actively contributing in all its activities.

2. Mr. Gadhadar Reddy Founder/CEO, NoPo Nanotechnologies Viga Studios Rebeam Space Inc. made a presentation on "Education: A disruption in progress". The Presentation focussed on the exponential changes occurring in the field of technology in the light of "technological singularity" where Computers and robots may force the human race into servitude. The presentation also stressed up the rapid adoption that is needed for education to cope up with the challenge. The presentation along with the recommendation of the expert is provided in annexure II.

The well-designed presentation was very much appreciated by all the members. While on the subject, Principal requested Dean (Academic) to consider some of the implementable suggestions like having a course in Programming & Networking, such as Python and others.

3. Mr.B.Anantha Bhat Managing Director, Chowki Services Pvt Ltd made a presentation on "Food for Thoughts on Quality in Education" on the teaching methodology and styles to acquire and transfer skills through various teaching practices. The presentation also stressed upon the importance of blooms taxonomy and classification of different learning objectives. The presentation was well-received and welcomed by all the members. The presentation along with the recommendation of the expert is provided in annexure III.

Suggestions

- Mr.Srinivasa Ramanujam, TCS, Industry-Member suggested to encourage Project Based Learning (PBL) and provide students with open ended problems.
- The Members also deliberated on the importance and need for the student to get knowledge, skill and attitude through self-learning. Mr.Srinivasa Ramanujam also informed that the TCS will be willing to provide live industry problems for the student groups through team of experts. The faculty guide of the groups shall articulate the learning outcomes. While on the subject, the Principal suggested that initially the departments of ME, EC and CS to take up the initiative with regard to the remote industrial training suggested by the speaker. Dr.G.Poornima, HOD-EC, Dr.H.K.Rangavittal, Faculty-ME and Dr.S.V.Sheela, Faculty-II were requested to facilitate the process.

· Mr. Gadhadar Reddy opined that duration of student project work should be more since issues related to choosing a good project, planning and execution, documentation and assessment can last quite a long time. This would enable the student to be more creative and focussed.

She also made a special mention of the contributions made by the IQAC Departmental Co-ordinators and IQAC office.
