However, this activity shall be further strengthened and efforts to ensure the technical affinity groups of the department leading to Open Electives Courses shall be explored.</p>
2.7	<p><i>Observations/ Suggestions made by the AC Members:</i></p> <p>Include measurable noise-free parameters in the feedback. For example: average percentage of BMSCE student performance in the induction program by the respective industry, percentage of BMSCE students securing their first promotion.</p> <p><i>Action Taken/Compliance:</i></p> <p>The suggestion is appreciated and the suggested parameters shall be included in the next edition of the Industry Institute Meet – Sahayoga.</p>

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**2.3 NAAC ACCREDITATION STATUS**

The Principal brought the following information regarding the processes initiated by the Institution towards seeking accreditation from National Assessment & Accreditation Council [NAAC] under Cycle II.

- The Institution was accredited by National Assessment & Accreditation Council [NAAC] with CGPA of 3.41 on four point scale at 'A' grade valid from 05.01.2013 up to 04.01.2018.
- The institution undergoing the accreditation process for the first time is referred to as Cycle 1 and the consecutive five year periods as Cycles 2, 3, etc.  
The Process
- The institution should submit IIQA/Profile towards NAAC (Cycle-2) Accreditation along with necessary attachments
- After the acceptance of IIQA, the institution will be asked to fill the SSR with the required document to be uploaded in the portal of NAAC website.
- The data submitted will be subjected to validation exercise with the help of Data Validation and Verification (DVV) process done by an expert team. The responses will be reviewed subsequently by the Peer Team during the course of the visit.

**STATUS:**

The Principal informed the members that the institution submitted the application (IIQA along with all necessary documents/attachments) towards Cycle-II Accreditation from NAAC on **31.10.2018**.

**2.4 DATES OF BOARD OF STUDIES (BOS) MEETINGS HELD FROM MAY 2017 TILL DATE**

The date(s) of the BOS meetings held at various departments/clusters from May 2017 till date was noted by the Council. The copy of the BOS minutes are provided in **Annexure-I**.

**2.5 DATES OF BOARD OF EXAMINATIONS (BOE) MEETINGS HELD FROM MAY 2017 TILL DATE**

The date(s) of the BOE meetings held at various departments/clusters for the period from May 2017 to till date was noted by the Council.





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**2.6 SUMMARY OF ACADEMIC AUDIT BY THE DIRECTOR – IQAC**

Dr. Mangala Keshava, Director-IQAC presented the process of Academic Audit conducted during February, 2018. The brief presentation in this regard is provided in **Annexure-II**.

The council expressed its appreciation for the efforts put-in by the Director, IQAC and Dean (Academic) in this regard.

While on the subject, the members shared the following view:

- Dr. Rajagopalan felt that, a formalized Research Audit be conducted for the PhD Scholars/Research Scholars and Research Projects/M.Tech Projects which finally leads to research paper or a patent.

He also suggested that, the Institute shall apply for recognition as Scientific and Industrial Research Organization (SIRO) under Department of Scientific and Industrial Research, Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India. This enables the students to associate with industry and perform collaborative activities with Industry (including internship and projects). It also paves way in creating of more number of Institute-Industry collaborative Laboratories.

He also emphasized on the importance of academic audit for PG programs.

- Dr. G. S. Venkatesh informed that, the University has mandated to conduct Audit for Research Scholar before awarding the Research degree.
- Dr.L.Ravikumar, Director-ICRD briefed about the process of audit conducted in BMS College of Engineering for the Research Scholars. He added that, the audit was extended to Innovative projects/QIP Programs.

He brought to the notice of the Council that, a Research Conclave for Research Scholars is proposed to be conducted during December 2018.

The Director, IQAC made the following observation/Concern on various academic matters during the Academic audit:

- In few courses the Grade distribution was of concern (large number of F-Grades / S-Grades)
- Academic performance of the lateral entry students is of concern (during their initial semesters)
- Academic performance of the International students is of concern (during their initial semesters)





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While on the subject, the Principal informed Council that;

1. Remedial classes are conducted for those students who are weak in mathematical skills.
2. Bridge courses are conducted for all diploma students to cope up with the Engineering concepts.
3. Special classes are being conducted for the benefit of foreign students during their first year of study

**2.7 RESULT ANALYSIS (UG AND PG PROGRAMS) BY THE COE FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2017-18**

The Controller of Examinations made a brief presentation on Result Analysis for both UG & PG Programs for the academic year 2017-18.

A detailed report in this regard is provided in **Annexure-III**.

Dr. Kesavasamy, suggested to have a comparison of failure rates for few years.

**2.8 REPORT ON PLACEMENT (UG AND PG PROGRAMS) BY PLACEMENT OFFICER**

The Placement Officer made presentation on the Placement outcome for both UG & PG Programs for the academic year 2017-18. The detailed report on Placements is provided in **Annexure-IV**.

The Council noted and appreciated the Placement Officer for improvement in internship opportunities for UG and job openings for PG students.

While on the subject, the following suggestions were made:

- To include placement details, together with details of higher education and entrepreneurs for the graduating batch
- Students can carry out project work in industry. However a clear distinction between the project work and internship is essential.
- The institution may propose its own methodology for evaluating internship work of the students. This will supplement the industry report on student internship which is already in vogue.
- Create department profile of publications through Google Scholar, Scopus, Web of Science, SCI, any other. The Principal added that the institution shall encourage publications in quality Journals and not purely based on impact factor.





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**2.9 DEPARTMENT PROFILE BY RESPECTIVE HODS (PHY, CHE, MAT, MBA AND MCA PROGRAMS)**

The HODs of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, MBA and MCA presented a brief profile emphasizing the academic endeavors of their respective departments.

The details are provided in **Annexure-V**.

While on the subject, the following suggestions were made:

- It was suggested that similar to the Mathematics department, the Physics and Chemistry departments shall offer Elective courses for the UG and PG programs.
- The science program faculty shall be involved during submission of project proposals for funding from various organizations.

**SECTION 3: ITEMS FOR RATIFICATION/APPROVAL**

**3.1 SCHEME AND SYLLABUS FOR FIRST YEAR COURSES FROM THE AY 2018-19**

The Dean (First Year B.E.) presented the First Year Scheme for UG Programs (from the AY 2018-19), briefing the various components of the scheme.

The Council approved the first year scheme and syllabus applicable for the students admitted for the academic year 2018-19.

The First Year scheme is provided in **Annexure-VI**.

**3.2 SCHEME AND SYLLABUS OF M.TECH PROGRAMS: 2018-19 ONWARDS**

The Dean-Academics, presented the broad frame work leading to revision in the Curriculum for MTech programs. The factors that have contributed in Curriculum design are:

- Program Outcomes for PG programs by NBA (July 2017)
- AICTE Model Curriculum for PG Programs (January 2018)
- VTU Autonomous guidelines (May 2018)
- UGC Circular (dated 20-06-2018)
- TEQIP mandate to implement AICTE model Curriculum
- Suggestions by stakeholders of the Program
- Recommendations of the BOS/DAB members





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Accordingly a series of meetings of the HODs and Program Coordinators for the PG programs were conducted to revise the Curriculum. The minutes of the meetings are provided in **Annexure-VII**.

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**3.4 SCHEME AND SYLLABUS OF M.B.A. and M.C.A PROGRAMS: 2018-19 ONWARDS**

The HODs of M.B.A. and M.C.A programs presented their respective Scheme and Syllabus. The Council noted and approved the same.

**3.5 ACADEMIC RULES & REGULATIONS IN RESPECT OF B.E., M.TECH., MBA AND MCA PROGRAMS (AMENDED DURING AUGUST, 2018)**

The Academic Rules and Regulations in respect of B.E., M.Tech., MBA and MCA Programs (Amended during August, 2018) was presented before the Council for Approval.

After detailed deliberations, the Council approved the Academic Rules & Regulations in respect of M.Tech., MBA and MCA programs (Amended during August, 2018). Further they emphasized on ensuring compliance to VTU guidelines, for vertical progression, particularly the Eligibility criteria for vertical progression of Regular students from first year to third year of their program. The Council approved the clause that requires students to clear First year courses, before proceeding to the Final year of the B.E. program.

**3.6 ADDENDUM IN ACADEMIC RULES & REGULATIONS FOR HIGHER SEMESTERS IN RESPECT OF B.E., M.TECH., MBA AND MCA PROGRAMS**

The addendum in Academic Rules and Regulations in respect of B.E., M.Tech., MBA and MCA Programs (Amended during August, 2018) briefing about the additional clauses applicable for the students of higher semesters was placed before the Council for discussion.

After detailed discussions, the Council ratified the addendum in Academic Rules & Regulations for higher semester students. The same is provided as **Annexure-XII**.

The Council approved to conduct parallel classes for B.Arch. Higher semester (III sem) autonomous students.

**SECTION 4: ANY OTHER SUBJECT WITH PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR**

1. The revised Calendar of Events for the Academic Year 2018-19: The Dean (Academic) informed that Council that, in view of three weeks orientation program for the first year UG and in view of late admission of first year PG the calendar is suitably revised.

The Council noted the changes and approved the Calendar of Events for the Academic year 2018-19. The same is provided as **Annexure-XV**.

2. A Student of Medical Electronics Mr. Vijay B., bearing USN:1BM16ML026 had requested for discontinuation from the B.E. Program vide letter dated 27.03.2018. Now, he has submitted vide letter dated 04.07.2018 that he had committed a mistake by asking for cancellation of admission and has requested for permission to continue the B.E. Programme.

After due approval of the Principal, it is decided to condone his lapse and consider his absence from January 2018 to July 2018 as temporary withdrawal as per College norms (No.14.5). and allowed the candidate to re-register for pending courses in odd semester for the academic year 2018-19.

The Council ratified and permitted the candidate to continue his B.E. Program subjected to his completing the program within the stipulated period prescribed by the University.





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3. As per the Rules and Regulations of the University, only 5 attempts are permitted per course. But few students have completed 5 attempts in a course and are permitted for **6<sup>th</sup> attempt**. The matter was placed before the Council for permission to communicate the same to the University.

The Council opined that, the Institute shall seek Approval from the University, and permit the students to take 6<sup>th</sup> attempt in a course.

4. Few of the students who have completed eight years of B.E. program are permitted to register for the ninth year in view of the University notification towards extending the course of duration for B.E. program. The matter was placed before the council for ratification.

The Council opined that, the Institute shall seek Approval from the University, and permit the students to register during ninth year of the B.E. program.
