The Chairman, BOG, extended a cordial welcome to all the Members & Invitees to the meeting.

The Member-Secretary informed that student representatives [both UG & PG] have been invited. The students were introduced to the BOG.

During the interactions the students expressed their overall satisfaction with the facilities provided for curricular, co-curricular and extra-curricular activities in the Department/College. They also expressed the following requirement/concerns for further improvement:

- To enhance industrial interface in terms of regular visits, internships and also placement opportunities in particular to the Department of MBA.
- Need for more assignments, specialized lectures from alumni and training on Personality Development.

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- Teaching competency and class room delivery in respect of few faculty members in two departments.

The Board informed the Member-Secretary to conduct a regular review of the performance of such faculty members and take needful measures for improvement. The Board also expressed that the departments need to enhance the number of industrial visits and extension lectures substantially. Accordingly, the Board directed the Principal/Vice Principal to ensure the compliance by the departments in this regard.

The Board thanked the student representatives for their suggestions.

The BOG was appreciative of the report on important Academic/Other Activities of the College for Sept-Oct 2014 (report shown at *Annexure-II*) presented by the Member-Secretary & Principal.

Section 4: INFORMATION ITEMS

4.1 ACCREDITATION STATUS OF UG PROGRAMMES APPLIED BY BMSCE UNDER TIER-I FORMAT (WASHINGTON ACCORD)

The BOG noted the Accreditation Status (as detailed below) of Under Graduate programmes under Tier-I Format (Washington Accord) accorded by the National Board of Accreditation (NBA), New Delhi. Out of eleven UG Programmes, five programmes have been accredited for a period of 05 years and rest for the period of 02 years.

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The Member-Secretary informed that the programmes accredited for 02 years, have the opportunity to submit the self-assessment report and compliance report after one year to be considered to formulate a view whether the compliance report is enough to recommend for accreditation or a visit to the Institute is necessary.

The Member-Secretary informed that the accreditation has enabled global recognition and greater flexibility to our degrees and increases the mobility of BMSCE graduates in the signatory countries for higher study and jobs. The undergraduate degrees of BMSCE are now acceptable in the nations that have signed Washington accord. BMSCE had the unique distinction of being one of the first few institutions in the country evaluated during the first phase of accreditation process under Tier-I Format.

The BOG appreciated the efforts of the Principal, faculty, staff & other stakeholders in this endeavor. While on the subject, the Member-Secretary informed that the SAR in respect of Department of Electronics & Communication (UG) seeking NBA accreditation under Tier-I format is currently being prepared and shall be submitted shortly.

4.2 GRANT OF PERMANENT AFFILIATION STATUS BY VTU FOR THE UG & PG PROGRAMMES

The BOG noted that the VTU through letter dated 21.10.2014 has granted the status of Permanent Affiliation to all the 13 UG and 10 eligible PG Programmes for the period from 2013-14 to 2017-18. In respect of the UG programme of Medical Electronics the PA status is for the period from 2012-13 to 2016-17. Out of 24 eligible programmes (both UG & PG) 23 programmes i.e. 96% of the Programmes have been accorded PA Status.

The Member-Secretary presented a report on the activities under taken by the BMS College of Engineering Alumni Association (BMSCEAA). Started with a count of around 500 registrations, the Association today has about 10000 members. The association developed network with alumni through LinkedIN and other social media tools. While appreciating the efforts, the Chairman advised to aim for a target of 15000 registrations.

The Member-Secretary informed that the BMSCEAA conducts Annual Alumni Day during December which brings together alumni under one roof. The Alumni Association has been encouraging its members to take keen interest in its activities and progress on the Alma Mater. The activities of the association encompass providing Merit Scholarships for the toppers, ceremonial felicitation of distinguished alumni and others. The Member-Secretary informed that this year the annual Alumni Day is scheduled to be held on 20.12.2014 and invited the members to join the programme.

The Vice-Principal and the TEQIP Coordinator-I presented a brief report on activities of TEQIP Phase II along with component wise details of expenditure incurred under the Project. The minutes of the 12th & 13th meetings of the sub-committee of BOG of TEQIP Phase II were ratified and approved (minutes of the meetings are enclosed at *Annexure-VII*).

The BOG ratified and approved extending financial assistance of 390 USD to Dr. M. Indiramma, Professor of CSE towards registration fee for the World Engineering Education Forum Conference 2014, scheduled to be held during December 2014 in Dubai, in line with the earlier decision in this regard.

The BOG ratified the selection of Ms. Diptoshi Roy and Ms. G. Padmavathi as Research Assistants to the Center of Excellence in Advanced Materials Research [component 1.2.1 of TEQIP II] on a Research Assistantship of Rs.16,000/- per month with permissible HRA as per the norms of the state government.

The BOG approved and ratified the decision of the subcommittee of BOG to engage the services of Dr. Shailendra Rao Nalige, COO, EHE Innovations Pvt. Ltd and Dr. Manish Arora, Open Medical Devices, Bangalore for providing guidance to the R & D activities of the department of Medical Electronics under TEQIP II as per the norms.

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The BOG also ratified and approved the permission granted by the Sub-committee of BOG to various faculty members & students for attending conferences/training programs with financial assistance & OOD as listed in *Annexure-VIII*.

The Vice principal informed the BOG that the second Performance & Data Audit of TEQIP Phase-II by Performance Auditor, Dr. A. Subhash Babu, Professor, IITB and Data Auditor Prof.B,M.Rudresh, Assistant Professor, Government Engineering College, K.R. Pet is scheduled to be held from 25th to 27th November 2014.

The Principal and the convenor of the sub-committee of BOG extended a cordial welcome to the members for the meeting.

1. Minutes of the meeting of the BOG held on 22.9.14.

The sub-committee of BOG noted that the BOG has approved and ratified the minutes of the tenth & eleventh meetings of Sub-committee of BOG in the 56th Meeting of BOG held on 22.9.14.

2. Award of Teaching Assistantships to full time Non-Gate M. Tech. students

The TEQIP Coordinator-I informed the members that out of 80 students who were receiving the teaching assistantship during the year 2013-14, 76 students have submitted their request for renewal of assistantship for the year 2014-15 and the assistantship is renewed for all of them [Annexure-I]. The Chairman of the committee asked the Academic Nodal officer Dr. H. S. Guruprasad to check the status of other students and to record the reasons on which they have failed to submit their renewal applications and informed the TEQIP Coordinator to submit the same to BOG subcommittee in its next meeting.

The committee perused the copy of circular issued and details of the fresh students who have submitted applications for the sanction of teaching assistantship for the academic year 2014-15. After detailed deliberations, the committee approved for the award of Teaching Assistantships to 86 M.Tech. students with effect from 1.10.14 [Annexure-2]. The TEQIP coordinator-I informed the committee that the funds allocated for the assistantships would last till March 2015 and the college has submitted proposal for additional funds under TEQIP II [1.2] from SPFU/NPIU for utilisation till December 2016.

The committee also approved for the award of teaching assistantship to 17 students admitted during 2014-15 to M.Tech. [Manufacturing Science & Engg] with effect from 1.10.14, from the grants of the Centre of Excellence in advanced materials research [Annexure-3] and the committee noted that this being the first batch of students, the funds under COE will last till December 2016 for award of teaching assistantship to the students of Manufacturing Science & Engg.

3. Award of Research Assistantships to full time Research Scholars

The committee accorded approval for the award of research assistantship to full time research scholars Smt. Sahana Rao, [BT] and Sri. Shivakumar M. [Chemistry] with effect from 1.10.14 whose registrations were already confirmed by the VTU. The committee noted that the applications for the award of research assistantship from fresh scholars will be received once the VTU confirms the registration/admission.

4. (a) Review of Procurement Plan under TEQIP-II (Component 1.2)

The committee reviewed the current status of procurement done under TEQIP II and COE and also noted that opening of the bids received against the NCBs called for, is scheduled during 27th- 30th October 2014. The procurement nodal officer informed the members that exact amount available will be known only after opening the bids and the last date for uploading the final procurement plan is 30.10.2014.

Considering the above, the committee agreed to meet once again on 30.10.14 and to look at the final proposals.

4 (b) Review of Procurement Plan under the COE in Advanced Materials Research TEQIP-II (Component 1.2.1)

The TEQIP Co-ordinator-I informed the committee that the outlay for the proposed procurement plan under COE is for Rs.321 Lakhs as against the permissible limit for procurement under Centre of Excellence (COE) of Rs.275 Lakhs as per NPIU norms. He also reminded the members about the BOG's consent to provide additional funds up to Rs.30 Lakhs from management for the said purpose, in its 54th meeting held on 13.1.14.

The committee informed to meet the expenditure for the following items out of Rs. 30 Lakhs to be extended by the Management and to seek BOG's approval for the necessary additional fund to the extent of Rs.13 Lakhs in addition to Rs.30 Lakhs already accorded.

6. Approval to the faculty, staff and students for attending programs.

- a) The committee took a note of the consolidated list of the approvals of the sub-committee obtained by circulation for deputing faculty/staff members to attend various programs & conducting programs under TEQIP II/COE [Annexure-4].
- b) The committee also took a note of the details of faculty/staff members seeking approval for attending various programs under TEQIP II/COE [Annexure-5] and approved the same.
- c) The committee also took a note of the consolidated list of approvals of the sub-committee obtained by circulation for deputing students/research scholars to attend various programs under TEQIP II/COE and also the details of research scholar seeking approval for attending program under TEQIP II and approved the same [Annexure-6].

7. Schedule of Second Performance Audit & Data audit of TEQIP II

The committee noted the second performance audit and data audit are scheduled during 4th – 6th November 2014 and the Chairman of the subcommittee agreed to meet the performance auditor on November 4, 2014 to represent the BOG.

8. Web based satisfaction survey


The committee noted that the NPIU has mandated for conduction of a web based satisfaction survey from the stakeholders of the TEQIP institutions and expressed its satisfaction about the survey status in the college.

9. Orientation Session of CH-EEF Services

The committee noted that the orientation session of CH-EEF services conducted by the SPFU on 27.10.14 was attended by the Principal and the TEQIP coordinator-II and also noted the contents discussed in the meeting.

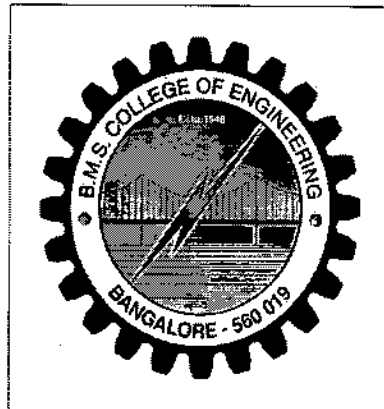
