3.2 REPORT ON STATUS OF NBA AND NAAC ACCREDITATION

NBA ACCREDITATION

The Member-Secretary apprised the Board the status of NBA Accreditation in respect of UG and PG programmes:

Undergraduate Programmes:

The total number of UG programmes are 12. Out of which 11 Programmes are accredited by NBA. Out of 11 accredited Programmes, 05 are accredited for 05 years [CE/ME/CH/TE/IM] and remaining 06 programmes are accredited for 03 years [EE/CS/IS/ML/E&IT/BT]. The institution has submitted SAR for the non-accredited programme (EC).

For the programs accredited for 3 years under Tier I, the NBA has informed the institution to submit a Compliance Report by 20th July 2017. The Departments are currently in the process of preparing the said report.

Postgraduate Programmes:

The total number of PG programmes are 15. The institution has submitted SAR for 06 programmes for re-accreditation, submitted SAR for 03 programmes for accreditation (first time), 02 programmes are eligible but not applied (format under revision) and 04 programmes are not eligible.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that the SARs submission has been acknowledged by the NBA and on request the College has proposed the dates for evaluation from September 2017 to November 2017.

The Board noted the same. The programme-wise status is shown at Annexure-I.

NAAC ACCREDITATION

The Member-Secretary apprised the Board that the institution is accredited by National Assessment & Accreditation Council [NAAC] with CGPA of 3.41 on four point scale at 'A' grade valid from January 03, 2013 to January 04, 2018 and the institution is awaiting applicable format for submission of SSR for Cycle 2 of NAAC since NAAC is currently embarking on revision of SSR Framework.

The Board noted the same.

3.3 FIFTH GRADUATION DAY (CLASS OF 2016)

The Member-Secretary apprised the Board that the Fifth Graduation Day was held on 01.07.2017 for awarding Degree Certificates to the fifth autonomous batch of Engineering Graduates (2012-2016) and the fourth autonomous batch of Architecture Graduates (2011-2016). The total strength of the students for awarding degree were 1059, out of which 860 Degree Certificates were distributed to the students on the Graduation Day and the remaining were sent in-absentia.



4.5 REPORT ON EXTENSION OF AICTE SCALE OF PAY (VI PAY) TO THE FACULTY MEMBERS APPOINTED ON CONSOLIDATED SALARY BY BOARD OF APPOINTMENT (BOA)



3. Audit of TEQIP-II & COE accounts by Internal auditors & SPFU appointed auditors: The committee noted that the internal auditor for TEQIP funds nominated by the college, Sri.B.N.Jayaram, CA & his team have audited the TEQIP II & COE accounts for the year 2016-17 and also took a note of the certified financial statements (Annexure-5).

The committee noted that SPFU nominated internal auditors, M/s Agarwal A. Kumar & Associates, Chandigarh audited the accounts for the period 1.10.16 to 31.3.17 on 30th May 2017. Further, the committee took a note of the auditor's report which stated that there were 'no key areas of weakness regarding procedural lapse' and no serious observations for the previous audit period and also for the period, 1st October 2016 to 31st March 2017 [Annexure-6].

The committee further noted that the Statutory Auditors, M/s GRSM & Associates audited the accounts of 2016-17 during June 23-24, 2017.

4. Joining of Central Project Advisor - NPIU

The committee noted that NPIU through its mail dated 2nd June 2017 informed that Dr.P.M.Khodke has joined NPIU as Central Project Advisor on 1st June 2017.

5. Online web based, Student, Faculty and Staff satisfaction survey

The committee noted that NPIU/MHRD conducted 3rd web based Student, Faculty and Staff satisfaction survey in March 2017. The committee perused the compiled reports of the 3rd round of web based Student, Faculty and staff satisfaction survey shared by NPIU with the institution through its mail dated 6.6.2017(copy enclosed at Annexure-7) The committee took a note of the main findings of the survey as mentioned below:

- BMSCE's satisfaction index score (4) is equal to the national average (4) for TEQIP-II institutions.
- BMSCE's satisfaction index score (4) is equal to the state average (4) for TEQIP-II institutes.
- Faculties at BMSCE are the most satisfied.
- UG students are the least satisfied.

6. Four Funds:

The committee noted that NPIU through its mail dated 23.6.2017 has informed that State Governments are responsible for issuing guidelines for using the four funds created by the institutions during the TEQIP period namely corpus fund, faculty development fund, maintenance fund and equipment replacement fund and the BOGs of the respective institutions would have the power to approve the institution's plan to utilise the said four funds.

7. Audit of TEQIP-II & COE accounts by auditors from Accountant General's office:

The committee noted that AG's Audit team audited the accounts of TEQIP II & COE since inception upto 31st March 2017 during June 5th -8th, 2017. The committee perused the auditors' enquiries and the response given by the institution for the said enquiries and ratified the same.

Further, with reference to the enquiry No.17 of AG's Auditors with respect to the 'investment of funds in FD', the committee noted that all possible efforts were made by the institution for judiciously spending the TEQIP II & COE grants received. The committee further noted that due to the time gap in the initiation of procurement process and final payment towards the procurement, on few occasions, the grants amount available were kept as fixed deposit for short periods in the same bank i.e., Allahabad Bank where the respective SB accounts of TEQIP II & COE are maintained. Further, the committee also noted that the interest earned thereon have been added to the total grants received and expenditure have been incurred towards the project activities. The committee recalled that the sub-committee had authorised the Principal to initiate/conduct the activities under TEQIP in its 5th meeting held on 20.3.2013 and subsequently ratified by the BOG on 28.3.2013. The committee further took a note of the amount invested as fixed deposits during the project period and ratified the same.

8. TEQIP III Participation:

The committee noted that NPIU through its communication dated 28.4.2017 informed that our institute has been proposed as Mentor Institute under Sub-Component 1.3 for twinning focus state institution, FET MJP Rohilkhand University, Bareilly under Sub-Component 1.1. The committee also noted that Principal/TEQIP Coordinator of the 1.3 institution was requested to deliver a presentation during the selection committee meeting convened at NPIU, Noida on 4th May 2017 and Dr.B.V.Ravishankar &

5.2.2 PARTICIPATION IN TEQIP-III



- Ph.D students in general are satisfied (score=4).
- Amongst various parameters the top scoring satisfaction goes to predatory support and research activity (satisfaction score 88%).

- Amongst various parameters the top scoring satisfaction goes to infrastructure (availability and access) (satisfaction score 80%).
