2. REPORT REGARDING COMPLYING WITH THE HON'BLE SUPREME COURT ORDER IN CIVIL APPEAL NO.17869-870/2017

The Member-Secretary briefed the Board that the Council of Trustees in its meeting held on 04.02.2019 decided to maintain the status quo and directed the Principal not to give the HOD post to Dr.K.Vijayalakshmi, Dept. of Medical Electronics and further directed him to withhold her Appointment Order for the post of HOD until the communication is received from the AICTE.

After detailed deliberations, the Board directed the Member-Secretary to maintain the status quo and also to address a letter to the VTU/AICTE for clarification in this regard.

3. GRANT OF ANNUAL GRADE PAY (AGP) UNDER CAREER ADVANCEMENT SCHEME (CAS) TO THE FACULTY WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT

In accordance with the guidelines and with the approval of the Chairman, BOG, Circular dated 26.02.2019 has been issued informing the faculty members to submit Self-Assessment in the prescribed proforma for Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) on or before 15.03.2019.

4. REPORT REGARDING NON-COMPLETION OF PhD BY FACULTY

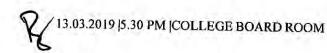
The Member-Secretary apprised that the faculty members (05) working under Management who were deputed for pursuing Ph.D and yet to complete have been issued memo calling for explanation.

5. REPORT ON SMT.D.SHARADAMMA, FDA, STORES SECTION

3.5 REPORT ON EXTENSION OF PROMOTION TO THE NON-TEACHING STAFF (ADMINISTRATIVE)

4.2 EXTENSION OF PLACEMENT OF Dr.B.V.RAVISHANKAR, PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING AS PRINCIPAL (ADDITIONAL CHARGE)

The Member-Secretary recessed himself to be out of the meeting during the deliberations since he being the aspirant.

The Board noted that Chairman, BOG has approved to extend the incharge arrangement of Principal in respect of Dr.B.V.Ravishankar, Professor, Department of Civil Engineering as Principal (additional charge) for further period of 6 months and proposal has been sent to the DTE in this regard vide letter dated 26.02.2019.

The Board deliberated that the post of Principal has fallen vacant due to the voluntary retirement from service opted by Dr.Mallikharjuna Babu. Since the said post is aided, it has to be filled by Direct Recruitment as per AICTE. Accordingly, the Board resolved to give an advertisement /notification in the dailies inviting applications. Further, the Board also resolved to continue the incharge arrangement of Principal in respect of Dr.B.V.Ravishankar, Professor, Department of Civil Engineering as Principal (additional charge) till the appointment of new Principal / regular person through Direct Recruitment.

After the deliberations, the Member-Secretary was asked to take part in the proceedings. Accordingly, the Member-Secretary resumed and presented the Agenda.

4.3 REPRESENTATION FROM DR.SAKEY SHAMU, PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING, REQUESTING TO PLACE AS PRINCIPAL, B.M.S. COLLEGE OF ENGINEERING

The Member-Secretary apprised that Dr.Sakey Shamu, Professor, Department of Civil Engineering has submitted representation to the Chairman, BOG and Trustees requesting to place him as Principal, B.M.S. College of Engineering stating that he is the senior most Professor in the College.

The Board deliberated to examine in detail regarding seniority and to refer it to the DTE. The Board noted that there is no Government order that senior most must be given incharge/additional charge/promotion and there are instances in the State Government where junior most staff/employee being elevated to the higher position based on individual's efficiency / capability and accordingly the issue will be irrelevant. The Board also deliberated that since decision has been taken to fill up the post of Principal through direct recruitment, the matter of Dr.Sakey Shamu claiming seniority and requesting to place him to the position of Principal does not arise.

4.4 APPOINTMENT OF DIRECTOR, ICD

The Board noted the following:

- That as per the norms of the Trust Deed, there is no separate identity for the admissions of International Cooperation Division (ICD) and hence all admissions shall be brought before the Admission Committee and ratified by the BOG of respective Colleges.
- That the entire admissions of ICD quota shall be handled by the Admission Committee.
- That the ICD comes under BMSCE and since it has come under the BOG of the respective Colleges, there are no provisions to conduct a separate BOG meeting of ICD.

The Board deliberated that in accordance with the above, the entire ICD process/activities have been merged with the respective Colleges and the admissions are to be handled by the Admission Committee.

Further, the Board also deliberated with regard to the decision of the Council of Trustees at its meeting held on 04.02.2019 in respect of providing three months extension to Dr.Jagadeesh.

After detailed deliberations, the Board resolved that the post of Director, ICD does not exist and is freezed since the ICD is merged with BMSCE and hence providing three months extension to Dr.Jagadeesh does not arise.

The Board also resolved that the cheques pertaining to ICD shall be signed by the Chairman, BOG, BMSCE and Principal, BMSCE.

The Member-Secretary apprised that as per the TEQIP-III Project Implementation Plan [PIP] and financial manual to meet the eligibility requirement, each project institution is required to build the 8% of the revenue generated (8% of aided grants which comes to Rs.16.00 lakhs) every year into a Sustainability Fund similar to that of TEQIP Phase-II Four Funds [Namely – (1) Corpus Fund (2) Faculty Development Fund (3) Equipment Replacement Fund and (4) Maintenance fund] i.e. depositing 2% in each fund. The establishment of Four Funds is essential to ensure that the developmental activities continue beyond the Project period and compulsory.

The Member-Secretary further apprised that the institutions are to utilize the revenue for building up the Four Funds, development activities, with approval from the Board in accordance with rules developed in consonance with Government Guidelines, if any. These rules need to be in place in each institution within Two (2) years of joining the Project.

The Board noted and approved to establish sustainability Fund.

Leave of absence was granted to Dr. S. K. Shivakumar, Trustee & Chairman, BMSIT & BMSSA who could not be present due to his illness.

At the outset Dr. P. Dayananda Pai, Chairman, Admission Committee extended a warm welcome to all the Members and Invitees of the Admission Committee for the First Meeting of the Admission Committee for the Academic Year 2019-20.

Subject - 1:

1-A) Fee Structure for Admission to First Year B.E/B.Arch Management Seats at BMSCE, BMSIT&M, BMSSA and BMSCA for the Academic Year 2019-20:

Dr. P. Dayananda Pai, Chairman, Admission Committee, explained in detail the fee structure of the different Engineering Colleges and after detailed discussions with the Members of the Admission Committee, the members approved the fee structure and decided to display the same in the Notice Board and the website of the respective Colleges during the start of the Admissions for the Academic Year 2019-20. The detailed report on the Admissions should be brought before Meeting of Council of Trustees for approval/ratification.

The Council of Trustees also noted additional financial burden due to the implementation of 6th Pay Commission Scales in BMSCE, BMSECE, BMSIT&M, BMSSA and BMSCA for the year 2019-20. To maintain the quality of professional education in our colleges and to retain the faculty, it has become necessary to reasonably increase the tuition fees payable by the students who are seeking admission to various UG Courses for the Academic Year 2019-20.

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A draft proposal for increased fees was presented by Dr. Pai, and same was discussed in detail by all the Trustees. The Chairman — BOG, BMSCE expressed that the current fee structure is quite inadequate as expenses have increased during the past 1 year. He also brought it to the notice of the Trustees that the other reputed Colleges in Bangalore have substantially increased their fees to make both ends meet and therefore, he requested the other Trustees for their support to increase the fees in each branch / college. While all the Trustees appreciated the circumstances and specifically mentioned that BMS Educational Trust and its Institutions have always been more responsible towards the wellbeing of the Society in general and student community in particular. In this context it was agreed that, BMS Educational Trust to carry on with the tradition of providing highest quality education to all the students at a reasonable cost and therefore no amount other than the prescribed Fee whatever be the nomenclature shall be collected from students. After detailed discussions, it was resolved that the suggested fee structure shall be adopted for this year as under:

Modalities of the Admissions:

The Admission Committee Members decided to allot the Management Seats based on the aggregate percentage marks scored in relevant subjects (Physics, Mathematics, Chemistry, Electronics, Computer Science) the Class 12th Examination on first come first serve basis, as under, for BMSCE & BMSCA only.

Students scoring 90% & above
 Students scoring 80% & above
 Students scoring 70% & above
 Students scoring 60% & above
 Students scoring 60% & above
 Students scoring less than 60%
 Minimum 15% of the Management Seats
 Minimum 25% of the Management Seats
 Minimum 30% of the Management Seats
 No admissions

For BMSIT and BMSSA, the seats to be allotted as per VTU / AICTE norms.

Sri. Madan Gopal, IAS (Retd.), Trustee, BMSET informed the Admission Committee Members that the entire admission process for convenience should be done for all the Colleges under the leadership of Dr. P. Dayananda Pai, as he is the Chairman of BOG, BMSCE & BMSCA and further he has been duly authorized to do so by the Chairman, BMSIT & BMSSA. He suggested and the Members approved the following points for implementation:

- i) All the enquiries/allotment of seats should be brought before the Admission Committee Meeting and it should have the approval of the Members of the Admission Committee. As and when admissions are over, the same will be ratified in the BOG Meetings of the respective Colleges.
- ii) All the Allotment Letters for the Management Seats in all the Colleges will be signed by Dr.P.Dayananda Pai.
- iii) The Management Seat Admissions should be transparent in nature and no advance deposit should be collected from any student who registers for seeking admission

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under Management Quota. Entire process should be as per the provisions of the Trust Deed and powers of the BOG.

- The Meeting of the Admission Committee will be held once in 15 days i.e., alternative Saturdays starting from the month of April soon after the results of 2nd PUC are announced and the same will be ratified in the BOG Meetings of the respective Colleges. The BOG Meetings of the respective Colleges will be held on last Saturday of every month to ratify the admission process.
- V) As per the norms of the Trust Deed, there is no separate identity for the admissions of International Co-operation Division, so all the admissions under ICD has to be brought before the Meeting of Admission Committee for approval and to be ratified in the BOG Meetings of the respective Colleges. Finally it was agreed that the entire Admissions of ICD quota should be handled by this Admission Committee following the same procedure as followed for Management Quota seats as approved above.
- vi) As the ICD Department comes under the BMSCE, there are no provisions to conduct a separate BOG Meeting of ICD and it has to come under the BOG Meeting of the respective Colleges. However all the MOUs handled by the ICD Department shall remain in-tact. In addition, Fee to be collected under ICD should not exceed the Fee structure decided as above for other management quota seats.
- Vii) Under any circumstances no Agency or middle man should be entertained in the Trust office for admissions of Management Seats and close watch should be kept on suspicious movement of any outsiders unconnected with admission process. Violations, if any, should be brought to the notice of all the Trustees immediately and suitable action must be taken.

Dr. B.S. Ragini Narayan (DT & Chairperson, BMSET) explained in detail regarding ICD, which was established by late Dr. B.S. Narayan during the year 1992, to attract the students from foreign countries for the admissions under ICD. She also explained that separate BOG Meetings of ICD were held since the establishment. The Chairman, BMSCL suggested and informed the members to merge the admissions and BOG Meetings of the ICD under the BOG of respective Colleges, as there are no provisions under the Trust Deed to have a separate BOG for ICD. However all the visionary activities planned under ICD should continue subject to approval of Council of Trustees.

Sri. Gautham V. Kalathur informed the Members that 30% of the Management Seats under ICD will be allotted directly by the GOI and EDCIL for the Gulf and other foreign students from Nepal, Srilanka etc., and the fee structure is as per AICTE norms.

The above points were noted and approved by the Members of the Admission Committee.

Subject - 3

The new Admission Office at the Trust Office:

The Chairman, BMSCE informed the Members of the Admission Committee that the Chairperson, BMSET has brought few points for discussion before the Admission Committee

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and amongst them one is the new Admission Office which has been identified at the Trust Office i.e., the existing Principal's Office and around 4 small offices near to Principal's Office will be made as the Admission Office, where the Director (Administration) will be shifting shortly. All the admissions will happen in the new Admission Office only (within the premises of Trust Office) so that the admissions are managed effectively and in a transparent manner.

The Members of the Admission Committee noted and approved the same.

Subject - 4

<u>Uploading of Fee Structure to our Websites (CET, COMED-K & Management Seats):</u>

The Members of the Admission Committee, approved/ratified the above fee structure and decided to display the same in the Notice Board of the respective Colleges.

Subject - 5

Any waiver / reduction in fees / refund / surrender seats allocation:

The Members of the Admission Committee suggested to bring the point before the Council of Trustees for concurrence and to be ratified in the BOG Meetings of the respective Colleges.

Subject - 6

Refund of Tuition Fees:

The Members of the Admission Committee suggested that if a student leaves within the 4 years period of the course, no refund shall be made for the amount which has already been paid. The instructions of AICTE must be followed in this regard.

Subject - 7

8 New Admissions:

The Members of the Admission Committee directed the Director (Administration) to refund the advance fees collected for eight new admissions with old fee structure and suggested him to inform the parents / students with an assurance of a seat if the student falls under the eligibility criteria.

Subject - 8

Any other points:

- The Director (Administration) was directed to note and inform the Members of the Admission Committee for scheduling the Meetings on alternate Saturdays.
- Those candidates who are allotted seats under management quota need to get admitted within 15 days of the receipt of allotment letter.

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The candidates need to inform the Admission office well in advance if they are intended to
join or planning to withdraw the seats within 15 days so that they can claim the refund and
the same seat can be allotted to the other students who have registered their names.

Since there were no other points to consider, the meeting concluded with vote of thanks to the Chair and all Trustees and invitees present.

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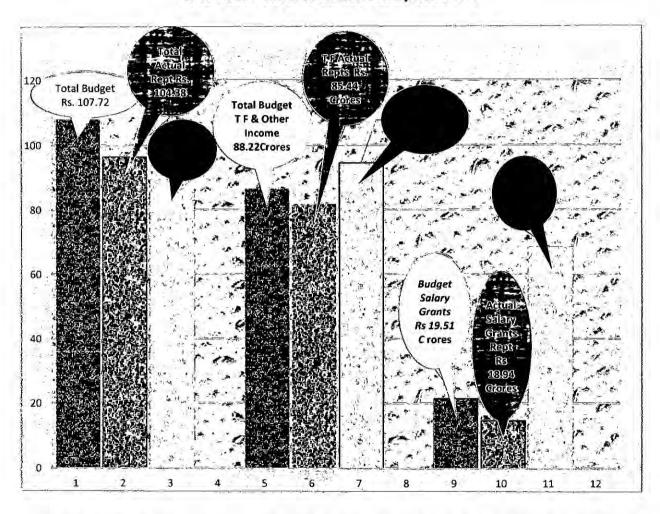

Section 1: INFORMATION ITEMS

1.1 Signing of MOU of TEQIP-III institutions with GOK

The committee noted that a meeting of all the Chairpersons of BOG/ Principals of TEQIP III institutions and the Principal Secretary, Dept. of Higher Education, DTE-K and Nodal officer, SPIU-K was held on 24.8.2018 at the office of Higher Education Council, GOK. The committee also noted that the meeting was presided over by the Hon'ble minister for Higher Education, Lead Educationist-World Bank and Central Project Advisor-NPIU and the institutions were informed to present the details of progress achieved as on date under TEQIP III.

The committee further noted that MOU between the TEQIP-III Engineering colleges & the State Government and MOU between the State Govt. and MHRD were signed during the meeting and also took a note of the MOU and minutes of the said meeting sent by SPIU-K.

1.2 First Performance Audit and Mentoring of TEQIP-III:

The committee noted that Prof. Avinash Gajanan Keskar, Performance Auditor nominated by NPIU conducted the 1st Performance Audit of the TEQIP III activities of the college during August 27-29, 2018. The following is our observation which arose during the course of our audit:

Payments worth Rs.14,13,215/- to various beneficiaries have been uploaded by the Institution
on 27.03.2018. However, due to a technical glitch (as informed to us via signed declaration) on
the PFMS portal, these payments were neither cleared nor reversed (as debit failures) but were
pending up to 04.05.2018 on which date, they were eventually processed and cleared. Hence,
as on 31.03.2018, these payments are outstanding.
 Further, these payments pertain to 2017–18 with audit evidence also pertaining to such period.

Hence, we are of the opinion that the treatment by the institution to classify these payments as a current liability by creating a corresponding asset (receivable to that extent, from MHRD), is correct. We further opine that this is a reconciliation issue rather than an accrual issue and hence, there is no violation of cash basis of accounting, in case of such treatment.

Recommendation for above observation:

The Institution should seek technical help from NPIU in cases where there are issues which
affect transactions and financial position as on the cut-off date i.e., 31st March of the respective
financial year.

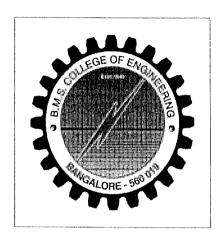

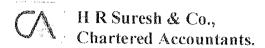

(a) OBJECTIVES OF AUDIT

The objectives of internal audit are as follows -

- To evaluate the adequacy of internal control system

Internal audit provides project management with timely information and recommendations on financial management aspects to enable the management to take corrective actions, wherever necessary, in due time.

We have conducted the Internal Audit of BMS College of Engineering, Bangalore for the period ESH of from 01 April 2018 to 30 September 2018. We carried out the audit as per the terms of reference

provided to us and in accordance with the standards on auditing promulgated by the Institute of Chartered Accounts of India and in accordance with the TOR as issued by funding Agency International Development Association.

(c) STATUS OF IMPLEMENTATION OF THE FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT SYSTEM

During the audit we noted that Financial Management System has been implemented for the period 01 April 2018 to 30 September 2018.

(d) <u>STATUS OF COMPLIANCE OF PREVIOUS AUDIT REPORTS, INCLUDING MAJOR</u> AUDIT OBSERVATIONS AND PENDING COMPLIANCE

During the audit we noted that there were no serious observations and pending compliances in the previous audit report.

(e) <u>KEY AREAS OF WEAKNESSES THAT NEED IMPROVEMENT, CLASSIFIED INTO</u> FOLLOWING AREAS:

i. Disallowance of expenditure as per the World Bank rules.

During the audit we noticed that all the expenditure incurred are in accordance with the Permissible Expenditures as prescribed by the World Bank rules.

ii. Procedural Lapse.

During the audit we noticed that there are no such key areas of Weaknesses with respect to Procedural Lapses.

iii. Accounting Lapse.

During the audit we noticed that there are no such Accounting Lapses relating to PFMS and books maintained at institutional level.

iv. Accounting books & records not maintained.

During the audit we noticed that there are no such Lapses in maintenance of Accounting books and records.

(f) RECOMMENDATIONS FOR IMPROVEMENTS.

We recommend accounts department to reconcile the PFMS expenditure amount with the book of accounts maintained at institutional level on daily basis.

During audit we noted that there were no serious observations for the previous audit period and therefore no compliance of previous audit report is required.

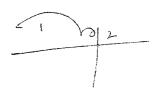
