The Chairman briefed the Board that the term of BOG members is two years except for the UGC nominee which is six years. In view of this, the BOG has been re-constituted. The Chairman expressed sincere thanks and gratitude to Dr.H.N.Suma, H.S.Shankar, (Retd.,) Col. members outgoing Sri.M.Krishnaswamy, Dr.C.Lakshminarayan and Dr.Samita Maitra for the guidance and advice provided for the development of the institution.

Section 1: ITEMS FOR CONFIRMATION & ACTION TAKEN REPORT

The Board noted the action taken on the decisions/resolutions of the 72nd meeting of the BOG held on 13th March 2019 with the following observations:

3.1 PROCEEDINGS OF THE 1ST MEETING OF THE ADMISSION COMMITTEE OF BMSET FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-20 HELD ON 22.02.2019

The Member-Secretary apprised that after the announcement of 2nd PUC results, the Admission Committee meetings are being held frequently and the minutes of the same are placed for ratification. The Member-Secretary also apprised that the admissions under Management & ICD quota are going on and admissions under CET & Comedk are yet to commence. The details of admissions under all the categories will be placed after the finalization of admission for the academic year 2019-20.

The BOG noted and ratified the minutes (shown at Annexure-I) of the Admission Committee held on 30.04.2019, 15.05.2019 and 13.06.2019.

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Section 2: INFORMATION ITEMS

2.1 REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE

The Member-Secretary informed that the monthly activity report of the college has been shared through email (during the second week of every month). The Member-Secretary presented some of the salient activities from March 2019 to May 2019 and its outcomes. On seeing the activities presented, the Board expressed its pleasure that the College has progressed not only in academics but also in co-curricular activities. The Board appreciated the efforts of the Principal and all the stakeholders.

2.2 REPORT REGARDING EXTENSION OF APPROVAL / AFFILIATION BY AICTE FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-20

2.3 REPORT ON NAAC ACCREDITATION

The Member-Secretary apprised that BMSCE has been accredited by NAAC with highest grade of A++ with CGPA of 3.83 on a scale of four in the second cycle which is highest in the country based on the evaluation made by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) PEER Team during their visit to the College from March 23-24, 2019 and the status is valid from 28.03.2019 to 28.03.2024.

The Member-Secretary thanked the Management for all the support and encouragement extended for accomplishing this great venture.

The Board appreciated the efforts put in by the Principal, Vice Principal, Staff and all the stakeholders for this great achievement and congratulated them.

2.4 REPORT ON NIRF 2019

The Member-Secretary apprised that the institution is Ranked 69th among top engineering colleges in the country by National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF-2019).

The Board deliberated in detail regarding the measures for progression in publications and consultancy by the faculty. While on the subject, the Member-Secretary apprised that it is proposed to establish Research & Development Cell for encouraging research culture amongst faculty and students.

2.5 REPORT ON RANKINGS BY VARIOUS REPUTED MEDIA ORGANIZATIONS (RANKING AGENCIES)

The Board noted that BMSCE has been ranked amongst top engineering colleges in the country by various reputed media organizations (ranking agencies) which conducts survey for ranking the technical colleges in the country. The rankings awarded by various reputed media organizations is as noted below:

 In the India Today-MDRA Best Colleges ranking 2019, BMSCE is ranked 6th among Top 200 Private Engineering Institutes and 3rd in South Zone.

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- In the Times Engineering Institute 2019 Survey, BMSCE is ranked 8th among top 140 Engineering Institutes in the Country and 1st among top 50 Institutes on Placements.
- In the Week Best Engineering College Survey 2019, BMSCE is ranked at 6th position among top private engineering Institutes in the entire country, 4th in South Zone and 1st in Bengaluru.

While on the subject, the Board deliberated not to be very much complacent on the rankings awarded by various reputed media and to consider only the ranks/certification/recognition given by the NAAC/NIRF.

2.6 REPORT ON SEVENTH GRADUATION DAY

The Board noted that the Seventh Graduation Day 2019 was held in the campus on 08.06.2019 for awarding Degree Certificates to the seventh autonomous batch of Engineering Graduates (2014-2018) and the sixth autonomous batch of Architecture Graduates (2013-2018). The Board also noted that Dr. Venugopal K.R., Vice Chancellor, Bangalore University was the Chief Guest and about 39 gold medals and 1154 Graduates were awarded Degrees.



3.8 REPORT ON EXTENSION OF PROMOTION TO THE NON-TEACHING STAFF (TECHNICAL)

The Member-Secretary apprised that the Non-Teaching Staff (Technical) were extended the benefit of promotion to the next higher cadre on the recommendations of the Promotion Committee dated 23.01.2017 by adopting the eligibility, Qualification & Experience as per C&R norms. 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3.11 DECLARATION OF PROBATION PERIOD OF FACULTY WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE

The Member-Secretary apprised that the faculty members recruited during 2016 (listed at Annexure-II) under Management cadre have completed their probation period of two years on January 2019. The Member-Secretary also apprised that the feedback report/performance are found satisfactory and hence satisfactory completion of their probationary period has to be declared.

The Board noted and declared satisfactory completion of their probationary period.

Section4: ITEMS FOR APPROVAL

4.1 EXTENSION OF NON-COMPOUNDED INCREMENTS FOR ACQUIRING Ph.D FOR THE FACULTY WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE WHO COMPLETED THEIR Ph.D WHILE IN SERVICE

The Member-Secretary apprised that as per Appendix III (para iv) of the Revised AICTE Pay Scales "Teachers who have completed their PhD degree while in service shall be entitled to three non-compounded increments if such PhD is in the relevant branch / discipline and has been awarded by a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC for enrolment, course-work and evaluation etc. The faculty who are in the pay band of Rs.15600-39100 + AGP of Rs.6000, Rs.7000 and Rs.8000 (as per AICTE notification dated 04.01.2016) are eligible for grant of non-compounded increments.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that in accordance with the approval of the DTE three non-compounded increments for completing PhD while in service has been extended to the faculty working under Grant-in-Aid and hence, it is proposed to extend the same to the faculty members working under Management Cadre.

The Board deliberated in detail and directed the Member-Secretary to furnish the number of faculty eligible and financial implication in this regard to the Chairman for consideration and approval.

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4.2 EXTENSION OF ENHANCEMENT OF MATERNITY LEAVE

The Member-Secretary apprised that the Board in its 63rd meeting held on 04.08.2016 resolved to enhance the period of Maternity Leave from 135 days to 180 days to the female employees working under GIA & Management. In accordance with the above, Maternity leave of 180 days has not been availed by the GIA staff, however, the same has been sanctioned to six staff members working under Management.

Further, during the recent auditing by the DTE Audit Team for the period from 2011 to 2017 observed that enhancement of Maternity Leave from 135 days to 180 days to the female employees has not yet extended to the Government Aided institutions. In view of this, the Board in its 71st meeting held on 29.10.2018 resolved to reduce the Maternity leave from 180 days to 135 days till the said benefit is extended to Government Aided institutions. The Board also resolved not to debit the excess Maternity leave of 45 days sanctioned already.

In the meantime, Smt.Ambika G Dath, faculty working in the Department of Electrical Engineering has approached the Labour Commissioner and also addressed a letter to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India for not sanctioning Maternity Leave of 180 days. The next hearing is on 02.07.2019.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that in GO No.ED 174 TPE 2018 dated 08.04.2019, the Government has extended the enhancement of Maternity Leave from 135 days to 180 days to the female employees working under Government Aided institutions. Hence, it is proposed to extend the same.

The Board noted all the facts and also Smt. Ambika G Dath, faculty working in the Department of Electrical Engineering approaching the Labour Commissioner and also addressing a letter to the Hon'ble Prime Minister of India for not sanctioning Maternity Leave of 180 days.

The Board approved the proposal and resolved to extend the enhancement of Maternity Leave from 135 days to 180 days to the female employees of BMSCE working under Grant-in-Aid and Management.

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EXTENSION OF SPECIAL INCREMENT ON SMALL FAMILY NORMS TO 4.3 THE STAFF WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE

The Member-Secretary apprised that the Government has provided incentive to promote the small family norms among the State Government Employees vide G.O.No.FD SRS 85 dated 01.10.1985 and the said incentive is granted to a Government Servant who undergoes sterilization operation after having two living children as special increment in the form of 'Personal Pay'.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that the above said special increment has been extended to the Government Aided institutions and accordingly the same is being extended to the employees of BMSCE working under Grant-in-Aid. In view of this, it is proposed to extend the same to the employees of BMSCE working under Management Cadre also.

The Board approved the proposal and resolved to extend the incentive to promote the small family norms to the employees of BMSCE working under Management Cadre subject to the fulfilment of the prescribed conditions of the Government w.e.f. 01.07.2019.

The Member-Secretary apprised that the minutes of the 1st meeting of the Admission Committee of B.M.S. Educational Trust (for the Academic Year 2019-20) were placed in the meetings of the Board of Governors of respective Colleges i.e., BMSCE/BMSIT/BMSCA/BMSSA and the minutes have been noted and ratified by the respective Board of Governors. 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6." REFUND POLICY

The Admission Committee discussed in detail with regard to refund of fees to the students who cancels the seat allotted. After detailed deliberations, the Admission Committee decided to refund the fees to the students who cancels the seat allotted as detailed below:

- a) To refund the fees collected by deducting the amount prescribed by the AICTE/Government till the commencement of classes
- b) To refund the fees collected by deducting 50% of the amount after the commencement of classes till completion of one month
- c) No refund of fees after completion of one month of classes commenced





The committee further took a note of the ranking / grade of our institute in baseline phase of the said SLA Survey conducted during 2017.

The committee also noted that TEQIP Coordinator and Nodal Officers (Academic, Finance and Procurement) of the college participated in the orientation workshop for student learning assessment (SLA) held on 5th March 2019 at AICTE, New Delhi.

The committee further noted that two Nodal Officers of TEQIP-III, Dr.K.J.Rathanraj, Professor, IEM & Nodal officer(Finance) and Dr.M.S.Dharmaprakash, Professor, Chemistry & Nodal officer (Procurement) were nominated as a third party proctor by NPIU for conduction of SLA survey at BVBCE, Hubli during March 15-16, 2019 and Dr.B.R.Ambedkar Institute of Technology, Port Blair, Andaman during March 26-27, 2019 respectively.

1.6 Mentor Mentee interaction meeting held at BMSCE

The committee noted that mentor mentee interaction meeting was held on 29th January 2019 and 22nd April 2019 at BMSCE during the visit of Dr. Manoj Kumar Singh, TEQIP Coordinator of Mentee institute, FETMJPRU.

Dr.L.Ravikumar informed the members that during the course of the aforesaid meetings, the issues raised at mentor-mentee progress review by NPIU conducted at BEC Bagalkot during January 27-28, 2019 and conduction of various twinning activities such as assistance for SAR preparation, curriculum revision, joint research projects were discussed in detail with the TEQIP Team and other concerned faculty members.

The committee stressed on encouraging Joint research & probable industry consultancy.

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1.7 Various survey conducted by NPIU, to assess the progress after implementation of TEQIP III

The committee noted that NPIU conducted various surveys and collected the information/opinion of various stake holders of the TEQIP III institutions through google formats with a view of providing the status of progress achieved in the institutions on implementation of TEQIP III activities for the Mid Term Review scheduled during Feb. 11th -14th, 2019 which could guide them in framing policies/further course of action. Further, the committee noted that in addition to the general feedback on impact of TEQIP in institute/departmental progress, NPIU made a survey on effectiveness/utility of PFMS software and AICTE mandates such as Induction Training, Internship, GATE etc.

1.8 Disclosure of Equity Action Plan on institute website

The committee noted that as per NPIU's directions, the Equity action plan of the institute was uploaded on institute website.

1.9 National Conference on "Equity: Achievements and Challenges"

The committee noted that Dr. Poornima G, EAP Coordinator of the college participated in two days National Conference on "Equity: Achievements and Challenges in India" held during March 15-16th, 2019 at College of Engineering, Pune, organised by NPIU and also noted that she presented till date achievements made in this regard by the college and the challenges being faced for effective implementation of TEQIP III.

1.10 Award of Best PhD Thesis award at MIND- 2019, NIT-Kurukshtethra

The committee took a note of "Best PhD Thesis award" accorded to Dr.Ambika D R, Assistant Professor in the department of Electronics & Communication Engineering for her PhD thesis in the first International conference on Machine learning, Image Processing, Network Security and Data Science (MIND-2019) held at NIT, Kurukshetra during March 03-04, 2019 and congratulated for the same.

1.11 Five performance benchmarks for continued funding for institutions under subcomponent 1.1/1.3

The committee noted that NPIU through its mail dated 9.3.19 informed the institutions about the new performance benchmarks for institutions as decided in Mid-term review mission of TEQIP III, for continued funding for project institution as mentioned at Table C and also took a note of the current status of the college with regard to the said benchmarks

1.17 Payment of first year AMC Charges to M/s Spectris Technologies Pvt. Ltd.

1.19 Reconciliation of Loan Amount extended by BMSET




2.6 Approval to the faculty for attending programs & conduction of Programs

2.14 Release of Advance / Financial support to students towards Research Internship at MITACS, Canada:

The committee took a note of the representation from four students who are selected by MITACS, Canada for Research Internship at various universities under MITACS, Canada seeking release of financial support, research internship and also noted that the committee in the meeting held 5.1.2019 had approved for extending financial support towards the same as per NPIU norms and further ratified by BOG in its meeting held on 13.03.2019.


BORE WELL WATER CONSUMPTION


The bore well water is pumped to overhead tanks. The gravity flow from the tank is distributed to different units of educational building to cater to the daily water demand.



R O WATER FACILITY


1. Portable Water Supply:

- a) There are 3 Nos bore wells, which are maintained by BMSCE plumbers and give a yield of approximately 1.5 Lakh Ltrs. These bore wells are supplying water to all bath rooms and common areas including Hostels at BMSCE Campus.
- b) Campus ensures that water supply and sanitation facilities are easily accessible. Safe, sufficient and affordable water to meet the needs of the students is being provided with RO water plant located at vantage places in all floors of the buildings and departments.
- c) The quality of drinking water is tested every three months. The overhead water tanks and underground sumps are cleaned every six months through a tank cleaning contractor. AMC has been concluded to replace spare parts and to carry out periodical services to all the drinking water RO plants located in BMSCE Campus. The record of the same is maintained in the office.




- (a) <u>Source:</u> Chemical liquid waste is commonly found in Chemistry Dept, Environmental Engg Dept and Biotechnology Dept labs.
- (b) <u>Type of Chemical:</u> These wastes include dirty water, organic waste, chemical liquid and wash water.
- (c) <u>Collection Methodology & Treatment Methodology</u>: After the experiment the chemical waste is neutralized/diluted and discharged into a series of settling tanks located outside the building. During the settling process the sludge settles down in these tanks and the clear water overflows into a collection tank and finally this treated water is discharged into the storm water drain. The sludge collected at the bottom of these tanks is removed periodically and disposed off as per KSPCB norms.

After auction and handing over process, the E-Waste recycler submits an E waste manifest and recycling certificate.

Collection of E-waste from the students. Red Colour Bins dust bins are provided in various locations in the buildings within the campus and stickered as "E-Waste".

RAIN WATER HARVESTING

To ensure an independent water supply during water restrictions, the College has implemented rain water harvesting in the Hostel premises of the College and in the Campus as well. The Indian hostels comprise of three units (Unit1, Unit 3 and Unit 4)

inside the campus. Rain water harvesting is carried out in two of its units. The details are provided hereunder;-

Unit-3 Roof top harvesting of rain water with necessary plumbing work has been implemented in the western and northern wings. The collected water from the roof top is let through a filter system into a sump tank of 2,00,000 liters capacity. The stored water is initially used for gardening and then pumped to overhead tank for use in bathrooms and toilets,

Unit-4 The rain water collected on the roof top is let through a filter system directly into the open well.


Roof top harvesting of rain water with necessary plumbing work has been implemented

in the Class Room Block. The collected water from the roof top is let through the filter system into the sump tank of 30000 liters capacity. The accumulated water is being used for the purpose of gardening. The roofs of the block / installation are being self maintained by house keeping staff weekly after rains.








Location-Between Lab Block & Class room Location- Boys Hostel No-3 Block



The purpose of this EoI is to identify an agency providing tool for testing and tracking employability of under graduate engineering students. The focus of using the tool shall be to measure and track the enhancement of employability of technical graduates and assess the impact of academic and non-academic reforms introduced in the project TEQIP-III.

The service provider/consultancy agency has to test Employability of students studying in engineering institutes participating in the project and track the enhancement through the reforms. This initiative is aimed to improve the employability of students pursuing engineering courses in colleges' under TEQIP phase III. The program envisages to use standardized employability assessments to assess students and identify their training needs. - 4. Provide a consolidated feedback report to colleges giving them an insight on their student quality and training suggestions for improving their employability.
- Create an online account on website for all students who take the test to facilitate access to their scores, feedback reports, and also apply for various job opportunities listed by partner organizations based on their test scores and skills.
- 3. Schedule of task

70 131

The service provider shall prepare online modules consisting of different components of employability test. The schedule for the test shall be mutually decided by the institute (client) and service provider based on academic calendar/ activity of participating students. The test is expected to be conducted for 1° to 4° year engineering under graduate students.

The service provider/ consultancy firms have to prepare appropriate online testing modules corresponding to each one of the skills mentioned above so as to make students industry ready enabling him/her to get appropriate placement of his/ her choice.

4. Support and input provided by the client:

- a. Client (participating college) responsibility:
 - To share a schedule for conducting an orientation and awareness session on employability tests and its benefits.
 - To provide the total count and complete details of students who will be taking the test in a pre-defined format.
 - 3. To share the schedule to conduct the test along with slots and computer labs at least a week before the test. Test should be planned depending on the availability of students and labs.
 - 4. Shall provide infrastructure like computer centre/ laboratories, internet facility & LAN, class rooms, photocopy machine, attendant and team of faculty for coordination.
 - Coordination shall include making students attending program, monitoring of attendance, collecting feedback of students, arranging weekly review meeting with head of institution, facilitating for getting accommodation, transport, working lunch to resource person etc.

Service Provider's responsibility;

- The empanelled agency shall be responsible for catering to the institutions included in Annex-1. The denial shall invite action to the extent of withdrawal from panel.
- Service provider has to provide detailed schedule of employability assessment/ test, providing necessary feedback to students and institutes management, counselling of the students, interpretation of results etc.
- To conduct online or offline assessments through an application software for comprehensive evaluation of students covering language, cognitive, behavioural and domain knowledge.
- 4. The test may essentially be ONLINE, however, it may be supported by face to face interview.
- Application should leverage cloud technologies to provide flexibility, scalability and reliability desirable for the scale of operations envisaged.
- 6. Applications should have in built security features to prevent malpractice during the test.
- 7. To provide their own servers to run the test.
- 8. To provide company representatives to proctor the test.
- To ensure all online communication is done over secured communication channels to ensure data safety.

5. Final output required of the consultancy organization

The final output must match with the objectives mentioned in para 1 & 2 above and elsewhere in the document.

- The employability score and the recommended area of work is expected to be accepted by majority of industry.
- 2. Synchronization of output with the needs of the industry from time to time.
- 3. The assessment tools and methodology shall be updated and upgraded as per the changing needs of the industry and as per the recommendations of advisory committee of NPIU.
- 4. The satisfaction of individual student on the counselling is highly expected.


6. Composition of review committee

1.17 Payment of first year AMC Charges to M/s Spectris Technologies Pvt. Ltd.
