The meeting was conducted in the new Board Room, Platinum Jubilee Academic Block. The Board Room was inaugurated by Dr.B.S.Ragini Narayan, Donor Trustee, Member-Secretary & Chairperson, BMSET, Dr.P.Dayananda Pai, Trustee, BMSET & Chairman, BOG and Sri.M.Madan Gopal, Trustee, BMSET. The Chairman thanked all the concerned for creating fabulous Board Room by providing all the facilities.

The Chairman, BOG, extended a cordial welcome to all the Members & Invitees to the meeting.

The Chairman briefed about the admission scenario for the current academic year 2019-20. The Chairman informed the Board that the demand for Engineering Seats is low in almost all the top ranked reputable Engineering Colleges especially for few engineering courses like Mechanical Engineering, Electronics Engineering etc., has been comparatively decreasing when compared to previous year. In view of this more number of seats have fallen







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vacant under CET/ComedK quota in almost all the Engineering Colleges in Bangalore.

The Chairman also informed the Board that it has been decided to constitute a Committee with former Vice Chancellor Dr.Khincha to review the existing courses offered in both the Colleges under BMSET and introduction of new futuristic courses during next year. The Chairman further sought the suggestions of the Board as how to generate the demand for engineering courses whether to forego such courses or to re-design the curricula or to introduce new courses which caters to the requirement of the industry/society.

The Chairman suggested the Principals of BMSCE and BMSIT&M to map the curriculum as per the present technological trends and re-orient accordingly.

The Chairman requested the Member-Secretary to present the agenda.

Section 1: ITEMS FOR CONFIRMATION & ACTION TAKEN REPORT

CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 73RD MEETING OF BOG HELD ON 27TH JUNE 2019

The minutes of the 73rd meeting of the Board of Governors (BOG) held on 27th June 2019 were confirmed.

1.2 TO NOTE THE ACTION TAKEN ON THE DECISIONS/RESOLUTIONS OF THE 72ND MEETING OF BOG HELD ON 13TH MARCH 2019

The Board noted the action taken on the decisions/resolutions of the 73rd meeting of the BOG held on 27th June 2019 with the following observations and modifications:

1. (4.2) EXTENSION OF ENHANCEMENT OF MATERNITY LEAVE

The Board resolved to extend maternity leave to the female employees of BMSCE as detailed below:

- 180 days of maternity leave who are on regular scales of pay working under Grant-in-Aid and Management
- 84 days of maternity leave who are on adhoc basis and consolidated pay
- To claim maternity leave through ESI who are under ESI Scheme





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2. (4.3) EXTENSION OF SPECIAL INCREMENT ON SMALL FAMILY NORMS TO THE STAFF WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE

The Board resolved to extend the incentive to promote the small family norms to the employees of BMSCE working under Management Cadre subject to the fulfilment of the prescribed conditions of the Government. The employees who underwent sterilization operation from 01.07.2017 onwards are eligible for the above said incentive and the monetary benefit shall be w.e.f. 01.07.2019.

Section 2: INFORMATION ITEMS

REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE 2.1

The Member-Secretary informed that the monthly activity report of the college has been shared through email (during the second/third week of every month). The Member-Secretary presented some of the salient activities from June 2019 to September 2019 and its outcomes. The Board expressed its pleasure for sharing the development of the College in various activities both in academics & co-curricular every month. The Board also appreciated the efforts of the Principal and all the stakeholders.

2.2 REPORT REGARDING VTU GRANTING CONTINUATION / EXTENSION OF AFFILIATION FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2019-20

The Board noted that the VTU has communicated dated 05.10.2019 granting continuation / extension of affiliation for the academic year 2019-20 subject to the fulfilment of the conditions stipulated by the LIC Compliance Review Committee and the same to be complied prior to LIC visit for the Academic Year 2020-21. The Member-Secretary apprised that the conditions laid down are almost fulfilled and any shortfalls will be complied.

The Board noted the VTU communication dated 05.10.2019 granting continuation / extension of affiliation for the academic year 2019-20 (letter is shown at Annexure-I).





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2.3 REPORT ON RANKING BY GHRDC-CSR B-SCHOOL SURVEY 2019

The Member-Secretary apprised that GHRDC-CSR B-School conducts Survey across India with the prime purpose of evaluating the performance of top B Schools to reveal vital and detailed information for the advantage of all stakeholders concerned. The categorization of the institutes will be carried out into several rating groups to help the institutes to know which category they belong to. The categorization ranged from Supreme B schools to Promising B schools.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that the Department of Management Studies & Research Centre participated in the GHRDC-CSR B-School Survey 2019 and has obtained total score of 761.43 of 1400, ranked 23rd among the outstanding B Schools of Excellence category across India which is also 3rd in Karnataka state and has been ranked as 14th by sector as per the November 2019 issue of "Competition Success Review Magazine". The Member-Secretary further apprised that the ranking of top 23 B school of excellence is as by Department as against B school of other participating institutes.

The Board congratulated the Principal and all the faculty members of the Department of Management Studies & Research Centre for their efforts in getting top rankings. The Board also directed the Member-Secretary to convey its appreciation to all the stakeholders.

The Member-Secretary apprised that the faculties are leaving the college in the middle of the academic term. This is not only causing lot of hardship for the smooth functioning of the academic & departmental activities of the college but also very difficult either to appoint a new faculty or to make internal arrangements at that juncture due to which the students will be put into hardships.





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The Member-Secretary further apprised that the Board in its 50th meeting held on 17.12.2012 had resolved that faculty members should not leave in the middle of an academic term and in order to curb such acts of faculty leaving in the middle of an academic term, the BOG decided to impose penalty of three months' salary to be paid by a faculty leaving the college in the middle of the academic term or semester and such faculty shall not to be re-appointed under any circumstances in future. This lapses of not following the above said resolution has been noticed and hence it is proposed to adhere the earlier decision.

The Board deliberated in detail and viewed seriously for not adhering the decision of the Board and resolved that the following decisions shall be adhered strictly henceforth:

- a) To impose penalty of three months' salary to be paid by a faculty leaving the college in the middle of the academic term or semester; and
- b) Such faculty (cited at (a) above) shall not to be re-appointed under any circumstances in future.

Further, the Board also resolved that in case of exigency, if a faculty leaves the College in the middle of the academic term, the workload shall be shared amongst the available faculty members of the respective department.

3.4 GRANT OF TIME BOUND PROMOTIONS TO NON-TEACHING STAFF WORKING UNDER GRANT-IN-AID

- that the Committee conducted several meetings and resolved to follow API specified AICTE Notification F.No.37the in 3/legal/AICTE/2012 dated 08.11.2012 with additional requirement/guidelines framed by the Committee. Further, the Committee also drafted Performance Based Appraisal System (PBAS) and API/guidelines for filling the prescribed application format and the same was uploaded on the College Website and Circular dated 26.02.2019 was issued informing all the faculty members to submit their academic details in the prescribed PBAS format through HOD
- that the Committee verified in detail the applications submitted by the faculty members and submitted a Note enclosing the list of faculty members eligible for sanction of higher AGP.
- that the eligible faculty members were invited before the Screening Committee for sanction of higher AGP





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• that the Screening Committee recommended for sanction of higher AGP and the number of faculty members eligible for grant of higher AGP under CAS with financial implication is shown below.

The Board ratified the recommendations of the Screening Committee (proceedings of the Screening Committee is shown at Annexure-II) and approved the financial expenditure in this regard. While on the subject, the Board directed the Member-Secretary to assign additional responsibilities to the faculties who are promoted/sanctioned higher AGP under CAS.

Further, the Board also directed the Member-Secretary to frame a standard manual pertaining to service conditions as per KCSRs/AICTE/UGC stipulated guidelines.

4.2 IMPLEMENTATION OF NON-COMPOUNDED INCREMENTS FOR ACQUIRING Ph.D FOR THE FACULTY WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE WHO COMPLETED THEIR Ph.D WHILE IN SERVICE

The Member-Secretary apprised that the Board in its 73rd meeting held on 27.06.2019 approved to extend three non-compounded increments for completing Ph.D while in service to the faculty working under Management as per the guidelines shown below and directed to provide the financial implication in this regard.

"As per Appendix III (para iv) of the Revised AICTE Pay Scales "Teachers who have completed their Ph.D degree while in service shall be entitled to three non-compounded increments if such Ph.D is in the relevant branch / discipline and has been awarded by a university complying with the process prescribed by the UGC for enrolment, course-work and evaluation etc. The faculty who are in the pay band of Rs.15600-39100 + AGP of Rs.6000, Rs.7000 and Rs.8000 (as per







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AICTE notification dated 04.01.2016) are eligible for grant of non-compounded increments"

The Member-Secretary apprised that 23 faculty members are eligible for sanction of three non-compounded increments for completing Ph.D while in service and the financial implication is as detailed below:

The Board approved to extend three non-compounded increments for completing Ph.D while in service w.e.f. November 2019 and also the financial expenditure in this regard.

4.3 REPORT ON SANCTION OF LEAVE TO THE FACULTY MEMBERS FOR ATTENDING TO VARIOUS ACTIVITIES

The Member-Secretary apprised that the faculty are attending to various assignments viz., Duties assigned by the VTU/DTE/AICTE/NBA/NAAC, Accepting invitation as Chief Guest, Chairing the sessions in Conference / Workshops / Faculty Development Programmes, to deliver lectures, to conduct workshops, Faculty Development Programmes, Mock Audit, Attending BOS/BOE meetings, examination related works and Attending Faculty Development Programmes, Workshops, Conference etc. and they are being sanctioned as On Official Duty (OOD) for attending to all the above said assignments. The Member-Secretary further apprised that as per KCSR No.12 of Annexure-B Special Casual Leave not exceeding thirty days in each Calendar Year may be granted by the Head of the Office to Government Servants:

- (i) Who are chosen or appointed as Examiners/Supervisors in any of the Universities in the State for attending the examinations;
- (ii) Who are appointed as Examiners in Para-Medical/Public Health/Engineering and Technology/Agriculture and Veterinary Services/Commerce and Business Examinations conducted by the Department of Vocational Education;





(iii) Who attend the meetings of the Academic Councils and the Faculties constituted by the Universities in the State

Hence, it is proposed to classify the above said duties and to set limitation of leave to be allowed to each faculty as detailed below:

1. Duties assigned by the Statutory Bodies i.e., VTU/DTE/AICTE/NBA / NAAC

Special Casual Leave of 15 days shall be granted in each calendar year.

The faculty members shall be permitted to accept maximum of 5 duties in each calendar year.

The faculty members have to take prior permission of the Head of the Institution well in advance at least a week before through proper channel and to get Special sanctioned Leave before proceeding. Thev have submit attendance certificate.

- 1. Attending BOS / BOE meetings
- 2. Attending Exam duties
- 3. Attending **Faculty** Development Programmes, Workshops, Conference (within India & abroad) etc
- 4. Accepting invitation as Chief Guest, Chairing the sessions in Conference / Workshops / Faculty Development Programmes, To deliver lectures, To conduct workshops and Faculty Development Programmes, Visit for Mock Audit etc.

Special Casual Leave of 15 days shall be granted in each calendar year.

The faculty shall abstain from accepting such assignments in the mid of academic session.

The faculty members have to take prior permission of the Head of the Institution well in advance at least a week before through proper channel and to get Special Casual Leave sanctioned before proceeding. They have submit to attendance certificate and report in case of Faculty Development attending Programmes, Workshops, Conference (within India & abroad)

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After detailed deliberations, the Board approved the above said proposal and resolved to implement w.e.f. 01.01.2020 onwards.





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4.4 REPORT ON AVAILING LONG LEAVE BY THE STAFF MEMBERS

The Member-Secretary apprised that the lady faculty/staff members are submitting request for long leave (more than six months up to one year) on reasons to meet their family abroad, on medical grounds, before and after confinement excluding maternity leave of 180 days. In view this the academic work is hindered and the HODs are requesting additional staff now and then. Because of this, not only the recruitment is being carried out throughout the year but also causing additional financial burden to the Management.

The Board deliberated in detail and resolved that all the faculty/staff members shall be sanctioned leave (Commuted Leave/Earned Leave/Leave without Pay) for not more than three months irrespective of the reasons subject to the approval of the Management.

4.5 REPORT ON RE-APPOINTMENT OF NON-TEACHING STAFF MEMBERS AFTER SUPERANNUATION

The Member-Secretary apprised that as per the resolution of the Council of Trustees dated 08.07.2013 the re-appointment scheme is being extended to the non-teaching staff members working under Grant-in-Aid and Management. But based on this all the non-teaching staff members working under Grant-in-Aid and Management including administrative heads viz., Registrar / Superintendent are requesting for re-appointment and their request are being considered.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that in view of the re-appointment of administrative heads viz., Registrar / Superintendent, they cannot be assigned any responsibility, the documents signed by such heads are not being considered by the Office of the DTE since the signatures are to be made by the regular Grant-in-Aid staff only and also the promotional opportunities to the next seniors for next higher positions is being deprived.

After detailed deliberations, the Board resolved to abolish the scheme of reappointment / re-employment of retired non-teaching staff (both aided and management cadre) and not to re-appoint the non-teaching staff members henceforth in the College.

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4.6 EXTENSION OF EARNED LEAVE AND COMMUTED LEAVE TO THE OFFICERS WORKING IN TEQIP III

The Member-Secretary apprised the following:

- That the Government of India under the National Education Policy with the assistance of the World Bank has launched Technical Education Quality Improvement Programme Phase III (TEQIP-III) commencing from 1st April 2017. The project was implemented through the Ministry of Human Resources and Development (MHRD) of the Government of India as a Centrally Sponsored Scheme (CSS) wherein 100% funds is being provided directly to the SPIU, State Institutions and ATUs from NPIU/MHRD as grants. Ten institutions including one Technical University (VTU, Belagavi) was selected from Karnataka to participate in this scheme. The State Government has also approved the participation of these institutions in the project.
- That the project institutions have formed an institutional Unit consisting of the Head of the Institution/Principal as the Institutional Project Director and Sr. Professor/faculty as the Project Coordinator. The activities such as Academic, Finance, Procurement, MIS and EAP are coordinated by Nodal Officers.
- That the Institutional Project Director, Coordinators and Nodal Officers are not paid any extra remuneration for the duties discharged for implementation of the project activities. The project work is carried out by these officers in addition to the regular work allocated to them. The project duty includes voluminous work with whole time job and the officers work even during general holidays and during vacation.

In view of the above, the Principals of the TEQIP-III Institutions requested for considering the officers working in TEQIP-III project as non-vocational staff and extend the benefit of Earned Leave and Commuted Leave for the project period. Accordingly, the DTE has issued order No.DTE/SPIU/39/2019 dated 26.09.2019 informing the Principals of the TEQIP-III institutions may consider the benefit of Earned Leave and Commuted Leave to the faculty working in TEQIP-III project during vacation and holidays as per existing norms.

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The Member-Secretary also apprised that the following faculty members working for TEQIP-III are to be considered as non-vocational staff and extend the benefit of Earned Leave and Commuted Leave for the project period.

5.1 REPORT ON CLOSURE OF TWO PG (M.TECH) COURSES HAVING POOR STUDENT INTAKE FROM PAST THREE YEARS - REG.

The Member-Secretary apprised the following that:

- The college currently offers 16 Postgraduate Programmes including MBA and MCA. The admission rate for various PG Programmes offered by this institution is around 93% from the past three years.
- The PG (M.Tech) Bio-Medical Signal Process & Instrumentation Engineering was started in the year 2013 with an intake of 24.
- The PG (M.Tech) Programme of Bio Chemical Engineering was started in the year 2013 with an intake of 24.
- The admissions for the said programmes have been consistently less over the years. The intake for the said programmes was reduced from 24 to 18 commencing from 2018-19 with the approval of the Chairman, BOG dated 06.12.2017. However, it is noticed that the admissions for the said programmes continue to be less. The percentage of admission for the past three years is 40% and 25% for the PG (M.Tech) Programmes of Bio-Medical Signal Process & Instrumentation Engineering and Bio-Chemical Engineering respectively. The lesser intake is invariably affecting our ranking in the National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF).




