The Chairman, BOG, extended a cordial welcome to all the Members & Invitees to the meeting.

The Chairman highlighted few important activities that took place during the period from October 2019 to February 2020 viz., Visit of NBA Expert Committee for evaluation of five PG programmes and all the five PG programmes have been accredited, Submission of application for starting of new course Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning from the academic year 2020-21 and establishment of new labs in the Department of Mechanical Engineering & Information Science & Engineering.

The Member-Secretary informed that students could not be invited for interaction in view of ongoing test. However, a few faculty members and few HODs chosen by the Director (Administration), BMSET have been called.

The faculty members comprising of few HODs and a few faculty members from various departments of the College were invited by the Board to get their feedback on the facilities and support provided by the Management and also to provide their feedback on academics and measures they feel for further improvement.







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The Chairman, BOG informed the faculty members that the Board of Governors is the highest policy making body and asked them to give their feedback.

The faculty members expressed overall satisfaction with the facilities, support and motivation provided by the Management not only on the academic issues but also other service benefits. They also expressed their gratitude to the Management for all the facilities provided to the faculty members.

The Board thanked the faculty members for their positive feedback and also asked them to provide any negative remarks if any, or any measures for further improvement. They expressed that all the staff/faculty members are very happy and grateful for having such a magnanimous Management which is facilitating to the needs of the staff.

The Placement Officer and Assistant Placement Officer were invited to present the placement activities.

The Placement Officer presented the status of placement and internships for the current academic year. The Board appreciated and congratulated the Placement Team.

While on the subject, the Board directed to change the nomenclature as Centre for Training & Placement instead of Department of Training & Placement since it comes under central facilities.

The Controller of Examination was invited to present the Result analysis.

The Controller of Examination (COE) presented a detailed report on the Results of Semester End Examination.

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Section 1: ITEMS FOR CONFIRMATION & ACTION TAKEN REPORT

1.1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE 74^{TH} MEETING OF BOG HELD ON 31^{ST} OCTOBER 2019

The minutes of the 74th meeting of the Board of Governors (BOG) held on 31st October 2019 were confirmed.

1.2 TO NOTE THE ACTION TAKEN ON THE DECISIONS/RESOLUTIONS OF THE 74TH MEETING OF BOG HELD ON 31ST OCTOBER 2019

The Board noted the action taken on the decisions/resolutions of the 74th meeting of the BOG held on 31st October 2019 with the following observations and modifications:

1. (4.2) IMPLEMENTATION OF NON-COMPOUNDED INCREMENTS FOR ACQUIRING Ph.D FOR THE FACULTY WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE WHO COMPLETED THEIR Ph.D WHILE IN SERVICE

In addition to the AICTE guidelines and as per Management norms, the Board resolved to extend three non-compounded increments for completing Ph.D while in service to the faculties who have put in 10 years of service in BMSCE

2. (4.3) REPORT ON SANCTION OF LEAVE TO THE FACULTY MEMBERS FOR ATTENDING TO VARIOUS ACTIVITIES

In accordance with the KCSRs and as per Management Norms, the Board resolved that for all the following duties attended by the faculty shall be granted as Special Casual not exceeding fifteen days in each Calendar Year instead of OOD as detailed below. However, the final decision lies with the sanctioning authority.





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- 1. Duties assigned by the Statutory Bodies i.e., VTU / DTE / AICTE / NBA / NAAC
- 2. Attending BOS / BOE meetings
- 3. Attending Exam duties
- 4.Attending Faculty Development Programmes, Workshops, Conference (within India & abroad) etc
- 5. Accepting invitation as Chief Guest, Chairing the sessions in Conference / Workshops / Faculty Development Programmes, To deliver lectures, To conduct workshops and Faculty Development Programmes, Visit for Mock Audit etc.

Special Casual Leave of 15 days shall be granted in each calendar year.

The faculty shall abstain from accepting such assignments in the mid of academic session.

The faculty members have to take prior permission of the Head of the Institution well in advance at least a week before through proper channel and to get Special Casual Leave sanctioned before proceeding. They have to submit attendance certificate.

The faculty members attending Faculty Development Programmes, Workshops, Conference (within India & abroad) have to submit attendance certificate and report

This is w.e.f. January 2020 as resolved in the 74th meeting held on 31.10.2019.

3. (4.4) REPORT ON AVAILING LONG LEAVE BY THE STAFF MEMBERS

The Member-Secretary apprised that the Board in its 74th meeting held on 31.10.2019 resolved that all the faculty/staff members shall be sanctioned leave (Commuted Leave/Earned Leave/Leave without Pay) for not more than three months irrespective of the reasons subject to the approval of the Management.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that Smt.D.Radha, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics proceeded on long leave from 30.07.2019 to 29.07.2020 to travel abroad for personal reason without obtaining approval & No Objection Certificate. In accordance with the resolution of the Board, she was informed (by mail) to report back to the duty immediately for which she has communicated that her kids school will end on 19.06.2020 and will plan to travel to India on 21.06.2020.





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The Board directed the Member-Secretary to communicate once again to report back to the duty immediately or to tender resignation for the post.

While on the subject, the Board resolved that henceforth all the staff/faculty members should obtain No Objection Certificate before proceeding abroad.

3.4 IMPLEMENTATION OF ACADEMIC GRADE PAY (AGP) UNDER CAREER ADVANCEMENT SCHEME (CAS) TO THE FACULTY MEMBERS OF THE DEPARTMENT OF MBA WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT

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Section4: ITEMS FOR APPROVAL

4.1 REPORT ON SRI.N.NAGARAJU, HELPER, DEPARTMENT OF MECHANICAL ENGINEERING

The Member-Secretary apprised the case history of Sri N.Nagaraju, Helper, Department of Mechanical Engineering. The Board noticed that he has been imposed penalty of reducing his salary by two increments twice for his misbehaviour and unauthorized absence. After detailed deliberations, the Board considering his case on humanitarian grounds, as a special case and as last chance, resolved to extend the following benefits:

- 1. That the period of his absence during suspension shall be treated as on duty and eligible for all consequential benefits.
- 2. That Salary of 50% for the period from 12.03.2005 to March 2006 and salary of 40% for the period from April 2006 till his reinstatement i.e., 02.02.2012 shall be paid and borne by the Management.
- 3. That regular increment from 2005 till the date of his suspension shall be sanctioned and to be regularized from that date.

This resolution supersedes all the earlier resolutions in this regard.

4.2 REPORT ON SMT.D.SHARADAMMA, FDA, STORES SECTION (REMOVED FROM SERVICE)

The Member-Secretary apprised the case history of Smt.D.Sharadamma, First Division Assistant, Stores Section (removed from service). After detailed deliberations, the Board resolved as detailed below:

- 1. That the subsistence allowance during the suspension period has not been drawn in respect of Smt.D.Sharadamma since she did not send letter every month mentioning that she has not engaged in any employment, business, profession or vocation either in private or in institutions where Government have interest in order to draw subsistence allowance for which she is eligible as per Rule 98 of KCSR inspite of informing her vide Notice dated 09.09.2014.
- 2. That she has not been reinstated for duty after completion of 6 months of suspension pending disciplinary proceedings since the disciplinary proceedings was already initiated.

3. That the period of suspension from 01.09.2014 to 23.11.2015 is treated as Dies non.

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Further, the Board also resolved to impose the penalty of removal from service in respect of Smt.D.Sharadamma w.e.f. 23.11.2015.

This resolution supersedes all the earlier resolutions in this regard.

- 4.3 REPORT ON EXTENSION OF GRATUITY TO THE STAFF MEMBERS WORKING UNDER MANAGEMENT CADRE (UNAIDED) AND
- 4.4 REPORT ON EXTENDING TERMINAL BENEFITS IN RESPECT OF STAFF MEMBERS WHO RESIGNS FROM SERVICE

The Member-Secretary apprised that gratuity is being extended to the employees of BMSCE on par with the Grant-in-Aid staff as per formula prescribed in KCSRs whereas other Sister institutions of BMSET are calculating differently. In view of this, staff members working under Management Cadre (Unaided) have submitted representation requesting to extend Gratuity on par with other Sister institutions of BMSET.

In order to extend all the service benefits in a uniform policy in respect of staff members working under Management Cadre (Unaided) of all Sister institutions of BMSET, it is proposed to frame General Rules with regard to service matters from appointment to retirement in respect of staff members working under Management Cadre (Unaided) of all the institutions under BMSET.

After detailed deliberations, the Board directed the Member-Secretary to forward the subject to the Council of Trustees.

4.5 APPROVAL OF THE BUDGET FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2020-21

The Board perused the draft budget thoroughly and after detailed deliberations, the Board approved the budget for the financial year 2020-21 (shown at Annexure-II).

ANY OTHER SUBJECT/S WITH THE PERMISSION OF THE CHAIR

5.1 REIMBURSEMENT OF REGISTRATION FEE / PER DIEM EXPENDITURE / TA FOR FACULTY ATTENDING THE CONFERENCE (INDIA & ABROAD) / TRAINING PROGRAMMES / FACULTY DEVELOPMENT PROGRAMMES

The Member-Secretary apprised that faculty members are being extended the financial assistance for attending the conferences as per the resolution dated 04.08.2016. However, it is noticed that few faculty members are attending conferences organized by institutions which are not premier and ranking less than BMSCE. In view of this, it is proposed to depute faculty members who are on regular scales of pay for attending conferences organized by premier institutions and organizations of national importance.

The Board approved the proposal and resolved that the faculty members who are on regular scales of pay shall be deputed for attending conferences organized by premier institutions and organizations of national importance.

5.2 DEPUTATION OF FACULTY MEMBERS TO PURSUE PhD

The Member-Secretary apprised that as per the resolution of the Board in its 67th meeting held on 25.10.2017, the faculty members are being deputed to pursue Ph.D only in reputed universities. However, there are fewer opportunities for pursuing Ph.D in MCA in reputed universities. Hence, it is proposed that the faculty members working in the Department of MCA shall be permitted to pursue Ph.D in VTU.

The Board approved the proposal and resolved that the faculty members working in the Department of MCA shall be permitted to pursue Ph.D in VTU or in the institutions listed under NIRF within 50th ranking subject to the approval of the Management. However, the faculty members working in Engineering & MBA departments have to pursue Ph.D in reputed universities like IISc., IITs., NITKs, IIITs, organizations of national importance like DRDO, NAL, CPRI, CSIR, ISRO, ADA etc., compulsorily.

5.3 REPORT ON Dr.SAKEY SHAMU, PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING
