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#### Section 1: ITEMS FOR CONFIRMATION & ACTION TAKEN REPORT

### 1.1 CONFIRMATION OF THE MINUTES OF THE $75^{TH}$ MEETING OF BOG HELD ON $24^{TH}$ FEBRUARY 2020

The minutes of the 75<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Board of Governors (BOG) held on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2020 were confirmed.

### 1.2 TO NOTE THE ACTION TAKEN ON THE DECISIONS/RESOLUTIONS OF THE 75<sup>TH</sup> MEETING OF BOG HELD ON 24<sup>TH</sup> FEBRUARY 2020

The Board noted the action taken on the decisions/resolutions of the 75<sup>th</sup> meeting of the BOG held on 24<sup>th</sup> February 2020 with the following observations and modifications:

#### [3 (4.4)] REPORT ON AVAILING LONG LEAVE BY THE STAFF MEMBERS

- a) The Member-Secretary apprised that inspite of informing Smt.D.Radha, Assistant Professor, Department of Mathematics to report back to duty immediately (by email) on 17.03.2020, she has replied that in view of COVID-19 pandemic, it is very difficult to travel. The Member-Secretary also apprised that she has been informed that she has to relinquish her position in the College. The Board directed to relieve her immediately.
- b) The Member-Secretary apprised the following in respect of Smt.Shaheen Sheriff, Assistant Professor, Department of MBA:
  - That she has been informed the Board's decision to sanction leave for not more than three months on her request to sanction leave for a period of one year to join her husband in US.
  - That she has been permitted, sanctioned three months leave and was informed to report to duty on 11.03.2020.
  - That she requested for extension of 60 days leave from 11.03.2020.
  - That she was informed that leave cannot be sanctioned and report back to duty immediately (by email) on 18.03.2020 for which she replied that due to COVID-19 pandemic she cannot travel.



The Member-Secretary also apprised that she has been informed that she has to relinquish her position in the College. The Board viewed it seriously and directed the Member-Secretary to relieve her immediately.

#### **Section 2: INFORMATION ITEMS**

#### 2.1 REPORT OF THE ACADEMIC ACTIVITIES OF THE COLLEGE

The Member-Secretary apprised that during the lock down period due to COVID-19 pandemic, online classes were started by giving training to the HODs, faculty & students well before the directions by the competent authorities. Tests were also conducted online. The Member-Secretary also apprised that in addition to online classes, online meetings were also held with Deans, HODs, Faculty & stakeholders and Webinar Workshops were held during the above said period. Further, most of the faculty members participated in the Webinar Workshops globally including premier institutions. Further, the BMSCE Team YAKSHA participated in SAE Aero Design West 2020. The event





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usually will be held in USA, but due to COVID-19 pandemic, it was conducted in the virtual mode. Our BMSCE Team YAKSHA were awarded 8<sup>th</sup> Rank under Micro Section among 75 teams from all over the world.

After, re-opening of the College on 04.05.2020, few more Webinar Workshops were conducted during May 2020.

The Member-Secretary also apprised that the Professor of IIMB appreciated our College for conducting Webinar Workshops with quality on par with premier institutions.

The Board noted the efforts put in by the Principal, Deans, HODs and faculty in conducting online classes and other activities during the lock down period. The Board appreciated and congratulated the Principal and his team. Further, the Board placed on record the appreciation expressed by the Professor of IIMB for conducting Webinar Workshops

### 2.2 COMMUNICATION RECEIVED FROM THE REGISTRAR, VTU REGARDING NOMINATION FOR THE GOVERNING BODY

The Board noted the communication sent by the Registrar, VTU nominating Dr.H.R.Prabhakar, Executive Council Member & Professor, Department of Civil Engineering, UBDTCE, Davanagere as Vice Chancellor's Nominee (University Nominee) to the Governing Council of B.M.S. College of Engineering vide letter No.VTU/Aca/A12/2019-2020/406 dated 04.06.2020.

#### 2.3 REPORT ON NIRF 2020

The Member-Secretary apprised that the institution is Ranked 73<sup>rd</sup> among top Engineering Colleges in the country by National Institutional Ranking Framework (NIRF-2020). It was also apprised that in view of new entrants participation in the NIRF 2020, the College ranking has been pushed down by 4 places. The Board noted the same. Further, it was apprised that the performance in the academic year 2019-20 has improved compared with the previous year. This would help the College to improve NIRF ranking in the coming years. However, the Board directed the Member-Secretary to initiate necessary measures in the parameters where the institution scored less and ensure that the ranking improves in the coming year.

#### **Section 4: ITEMS FOR APPROVAL**

### 4.1 REPORT ON FILING OF PETITIONS BY DR.SAKEY SHAMU, PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF CIVIL ENGINEERING

The Board noted that the Hon'ble High Court of Karnataka disposed the Petitions filed by Dr.Sakey Shamu and directing the Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Karnataka, Education Department (Higher Education), Bengaluru to take a decision in terms of the communication of the Director of Technical Education dated 07.02.2019 in an expedite manner.

The Board noted that Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Karnataka, Education Department (Higher Education), Bengaluru in the proceedings dated 02.05.2020 viewed the failure of Dr.Sakey Shamu to perform his duties and responsibilities both in administration, academics and also his failure to prove his case for considering him to the post of incharge Principal. The Board also noted





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that the Additional Chief Secretary to Government of Karnataka also viewed that incharge Principal is a temporary arrangement as the post of Principal has to be filled up by Direct Recruitment as per the guidelines of the AICTE and hence the question of considering the seniority to appoint incharge Principal of B.M.S. College of Engineering does not arise. Accordingly, Dr.Sakey Shamu is not entitled for relief sought by him and hence his petition has been rejected.

The Board after detailed deliberations, resolved to initiate disciplinary action in respect of Dr.Sakey Shamu as per KCSRs for making unnecessary allegations on the Management and as well as on few fellow colleagues.

4.2 REPRESENTATION FROM Dr.M.RAJYALAKSHMI, RETIRED PROFESSOR, DEPARTMENT OF BIOTECHNOLOGY REQUESTING TO SET RIGHT THE ANOMALY IN CALCULATION OF GRATUITY

The Member-Secretary apprised the following:

- That Dr.M.Rajyalakshmi, was working as Professor in the Department of Biotechnology under Management Cadre and she retired on attaining the age of superannuation on 31.07.2019. She has been sanctioned terminal benefit as per KCSRs i.e., gratuity calculated as prescribed in the KCSRs DCRG = Emoluments (last drawn basic pay) X Qualifying Service X 1/4, which is being in practice in case of both for GIA (verified and approved by the DTE and AG's in respect of GIA staff) and Management staff till date.
- That Dr.M.Rajyalakshmi in her representation has requested to pay her the difference amount Rs.11,05,252/- arising due to calculation of Gratuity using the formula DCRG = [ (Basic Pay + DA) X 15 days X No of year of service]/26. She has submitted several representations stating that as per Gratuity Act she is eligible for gratuity of Rs.16,45,412, while she has been paid a total sum of Rs.5,40,160/- and has requested to release the balance amount of Rs.11,05,252/- at the earliest failing which she will approach the competent authority for justice if no information is heard in this regard.





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- That as per KCS Rule No.293 E and GO No. FD 33 PEN 2018, dated 24.04.2018:
  - "The term emoluments for purpose of calculating various retirement and death benefits and family pension shall mean the Basic Pay drawn by a Government servant in the scale of pay applicable to the post held by him on the date of retirement/ death shall also include
  - a) Stagnation increment, if any granted above the maximum of the scale of pay
  - b) Personal pay, if any granted to him under the sub-rule 3 of Rule 7 of the Karnataka Civil Service (Revised Pay) Rules, 2018
  - c) Additional increments granted beyond the maximum of the time scale of pay of 20, 25 and 30 years of service."
- That the Board in its meeting held on 22.03.2003 resolved to extend Gratuity benefit to the Management employees as per Norms and Rules of the Government. Further, the Board in its meeting held on 08.04.2015 resolved to extend Voluntary Retirement from Service for the staff working under Management Cadre as per KCSRs.
- That this institution is following the Government Rules applicable to Aided Institutions. This institution is running both aided and unaided programs as such there are employees working under both Grant-in-Aid and Management. The employees working under Grant-in-Aid are being extended the service benefits as per KCSRs in accordance with the approval of Government / Directorate of Technical Education. The employees working under Management are also being extended the service benefits on par with Grant-in-Aid employees following the KCSRs in accordance with the approval of the Board of Governors.
- That on enquiry by one of the NBA Expert Committee regarding the norms/rules/service benefits followed in respect of the employees working under Management Cadre, a Declaration has been submitted "that all the employees working under management are also being extended the service benefits on par with Grant-in-Aid employees following the KCSRs in accordance with the approval of the Board of Governors from time to time except for the terminal benefits i.e., Grant-





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in-Aid employees will get Gratuity & Pension from Government whereas management employees will get Gratuity from the Management & PF from the Office of the Provident Fund". The same has been resolved/ratified by the Board in its 69<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 23.04.2018.

- That as per G.O. No. ED 176 UPC 75 dated: 18.08.1976, the maximum limit for sanction of DCRG is limited to Rs.10,00,000/- in respect of Teaching staff who are drawing AICTE Scales of Pay.
- That it is ascertained from other Aided Engineering Colleges in Karnataka that even they are following KCSRs in respect of Management employees as is being followed in respect of Grant-in-Aid employees.

The Board noted that the Board in the previous meetings have resolved to follow the KCSRs in extending all the benefits including terminal benefits to the employees working under Management Cadre on par with Grant-in-Aid employees. The Board also deliberated in detail that there should be cause of action to change / modify the earlier decisions. Since there is no cause of action to change /modify the earlier decisions, the Board resolved to continue extending the terminal benefits to the employees working under Management Cadre as per KCSRs on par with Grant-in-Aid employees.

### 4.3 GRANT OF TIME BOUND PROMOTIONS TO NON-TEACHING STAFF WORKING UNDER GRANT-IN-AID

The Board took note that an employee is eligible for Time Bound Promotions who has put in 10/15/20/25/30 years of service as the case may be in the same cadre/post held by them without any promotion and having satisfactory performance record.





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The Board also noted that the following Non-teaching staff members (working under GIA) have completed 25 years of service in the same cadre and are eligible for grant of time-bound promotion.

## 5.1 REPORT REGARDING APPLICATION SUBMITTED TO AICTE & VTU SEEKING EXTENSION OF APPROVAL / AFFILIATION FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR 2020-21

The Member-Secretary apprised that the Board in its 74<sup>th</sup> meeting held on 31.10.2019 resolved to close the PG Porgrammes – M.Tech. in Bio-Medical Signal Process & Instrumentation Engg and M.Tech. in Bio-Chemical Engineering from the ensuing academic year 2020-21 since the admissions for the said programmes have been consistently less over the years. Since the PG programme- M.Tech. in Bio-Medical Signal Process & Instrumentation Engg has been accredited by the National Board of Accreditation (NBA) for the period from 2019-2020 to 2021-2022, the institution has not sought the approval for closure of the said PG programme.





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#### a) AICTE:

The Board noted that the Scrutiny Committee, AICTE has recommended the following:

- Extension of Approval for the programmes offered in the College for the programmes offered in the College for the Academic Year 2020-21.
- Starting of new UG Programme in Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning with an intake of 60 students commencing from the Academic Year 2020-21.
- Closure of M.Tech. programme Bio-Chemical Engineering from the ensuing academic year 2020-21.

The Board also noted that the approval from the AICTE will be received shortly.

#### b) VTU:

The Board noted that the institution has submitted application (online) for Continuation/Temporary Affiliation for 06 UG Programmes and 07 PG Programmes, Extension of Affiliation for 11 Research Centers and starting of new UG Programme in Artificial Intelligence & Machine Learning with an intake of 60 students commencing from the AY 2020-21. The Board also noted that the online annual inspection and affiliation by Local Inquiry Committee (LIC) of Visvesvaraya Technological University, Belagavi is scheduled on 22.06.2020.

#### 5.2 REPORT ON STATUS OF ACCREDITATION BY NBA

The Board took note of the following:
