One of the deadliest industrial catastrophes in history, the Bhopal gas tragedy highlighted the perils of unrestricted industry and pollution. Methyl isocyanate (MIC), one of the poisonous chemicals that were released as a result of the gas leak, caused respiratory issues, eyesight, and other health issues among the people who were exposed to it.

According to estimates, more than 500,000 individuals were exposed to the gas, and more than 15,000 people died.

The significance of National Pollution Control Day is highlighted by the fact that pollution is a major problem in India, with various sources contributing to air, water, and soil pollution. Industrialization, urbanization, and population growth have all contributed to the rise in pollution levels, leading to various health issues and environmental degradation.

Many initiatives and programmes are carried out in the country to increase public understanding of the dangers of pollution and the importance of pollution control.
